



One may become temporarily deaf, with a disagreeable and very annoying buzzing in the ears. Some patients describe it as a roaring or ringing in the ears. One may suspect the cause, especially if it has occurred before, but often a patient neglects the matter for weeks before seeking medical aid.

What is the cause of a floating kidney? A floating kidney seldom requires an operation and only rarely gives rise to serious symptoms. Auto-intoxication with constipation is the cause of bilious attacks, and may become acute. The diet should consist chiefly of fruits, fruit juices, fresh vegetables, coarse cereals and bran.
