FRED FULTON, the furious and pugnacious plasterer, was awarded the championship of something yesterday afternoon when Referee Matt Hinkel disqualified Carl Morris.

At the National Championships in Baltimore, 1914, Goelitz won the senior high hurdles and Joe Loomis, another Chicago lad, took the low in which Goelitz finished second.

The best the Philadelphians could get in the half-mile relay was second with Allen Woodring, Howard Berry, Elmer Smith and Ted Meredith exchanging the baton. The winner of the 880 yards classic was the Chicago A. A., the runners being Sherman Landers, Frank Loomis, Floyd Smart and Andrew Ward. The time for this race was 1 minute 23 3/5 seconds, only one-fifth of a second slower than the world's record for the distance. This is held by Chicago University, on which ran Andy Ward, who competed; Binga Dismond, Barank and Knight. These runners established the mark in 1915 at Chicago.
