

COURSE IN CIVICS

Extended to Higher Grades and Made to Cover All Functions of Government

BIG STUDENT INTEREST

City Educators Work Out Modern System of Teaching Free From Formality

The new idea in education has come to Philadelphia public schools to stay. The old regime of iron discipline and dry studies has been displaced for all time by the march of progress.

A course in civics, designed to make good citizens of the students, was established in the six lower grades of the public schools in October, 1914.

This course has proved so successful, has created such enthusiasm among the children, teachers and parents, that on November 1 it will be extended to the seventh and eighth grades, according to announcement made today by Dr. Theodore L. MacDowell, associate superintendent of schools, from his office in the Keystone Building, Nineteenth street above Chestnut.

The course has been worked out with care by Doctor MacDowell, as chairman, and a committee of school principals, department heads, teachers and other educational experts in the city.

The new idea in education, it is said to mark the first step in the installation of the most modern and advanced methods in Philadelphia public schools.

This course in civics was instituted last year as an experiment," said Doctor MacDowell. "It has proved most successful.

It is intended to supersede the course in civics which in the past has been extremely formal.

The new civics course is absolutely informal. It is intended to gradually lead the children up from a consideration of matters which interest them to realization of the functions of government—city, State and Federal.

It does away with the old formal methods of learning the Constitution by heart and reciting it like a parrot. The primary function in modern education is to interest the children and to hold that interest, in this manner, to instruct them.

This new course has been a most important step in the history of civics in Philadelphia. It is intended to supersede the course in civics which in the past has been extremely formal.

The course begins in the first grade, with consideration of the fundamental civic virtues, morals and manners. The children are led by the hand in these lines. We learn to produce illustrations of points raised and to take a lively interest in the subject as being one that touches vitally upon the individual life.

This civics course is designed to interest the children and to hold that interest, in this manner, to instruct them. This new course has been a most important step in the history of civics in Philadelphia.

Beginning with the first grade, the course continues directly through the other grades, with consideration of the various grades of civics.

Second grade: Punctuality, truthfulness, care of property, fair play, safety and kindness to animals.

Third grade: Thoroughness, honesty, respect, kindness to animals.

Fourth grade: Cleanliness, self-control, thrift, perseverance, kindness to animals, and a study of the policeman, the fireman, the postman, the street cleaner, the garbage collector, the ash and rubbish collector.

Fifth grade: Water supply, gas, electricity, telephone, the neighborhood, the city beautiful, and safety first.

Sixth grade: Philadelphia, its industries and occupations, including a study of industry for which the child is fitted, his occupations, condition of work and ethics in business.

Seventh grade: Health, protection of life and property, education, recreation and sports.

Eighth grade: Communication, transportation and wealth.

The first three grades gradually impress upon the child not only his duty as an individual, but his part in the State. It brings to him a realization of the fact that he has duties to others, as others have duties to him.

Service is made the dominant note. No child has been so near to the government and public servants. The ground is being prepared for the children's sensing the necessity for such institutions.

In the fourth grade advantage is taken of the previous preparation and the need for the policeman, the postman, the street cleaner, etc., and the place each occupies in the child's life is brought out.

In the fifth the idea is extended and the necessity for officials somewhat more remote from the child is shown. The manner in which the water inspector helps preserve the child's life and health is dwelt upon, for example.

In the sixth grade the interrelation existing between all the inhabitants and all the industries of the city are brought out, with a special study of conditions in Philadelphia.

HIGHER FUNCTIONS OF GOVERNMENT

In the seventh and eighth grades a more detailed study of the various departments of the relations between the citizen and the government is made.

These two grades, established in this course now for the first time, are a culmination of the work of the previous grades.

The student gets a detailed account of the workings of the Government and of its various departments.

In the previous grades they have been taught the duties and the citizen. They have been gradually led to a knowledge of the function of government and the provinces of the city, State and Federal governments.

In these last two grades the subject is brought to a close. The class has been brought to a point where it sees that people are bound to each other in such a way that the welfare of all may be advanced.

As a group they can secure more for themselves than they can singly. These last two years of the study are devoted to determining the common interests which the communities are seeking and how they may best be obtained.

Another innovation to be introduced with this course is a "civics laboratory." This consists of a bulletin board in each class room, reports and bulletins of various kinds, pictures and lantern slides, plans and charts, maps, samples and models.

No textbook has been issued for the course. A very complete course of study in the teacher's guide has been supplied. This contains a minute sketch of the work, and yet leaves a lot to the initiative of the teacher. It contains a complete list of books and articles which are available on the various topics which may be used by the class and by the teacher.

COMPLETE U. S. WAREHOUSES

Buildings, Completed in France, Filled With Red Cross Supplies

WASHINGTON, Oct. 9.—Sixteen big warehouses for the new war relief distribution system have been completed abroad, according to a dispatch from the American Red Cross from its commission in France. Six of the buildings are in Paris and the others in departments outside of the capital, and all are filled with supplies ranging from medicines, clothes and food to building materials and farm implements.

American ambulances, many of whom formerly drove ambulances at the front, are directing the system.
