AMERICA AND ALLIES ONE IN WAR PLANS

Constant Personal Touch to be Accomplished Through General Bliss's Presence

WILL REMAIN IN EUROPE

Bear Wilson's Ideas and Assurance That Men and Supplies Are Ready

WASHINGTON, Jan. 25.—The United States and her allies propose actual harmony and co-operation in war work henceforth through constant personal touch.

This will be attained by having General Tasker H. Bliss, chief of staff, who will remain in Europe practically constantly until the machinery of co-operation is running without friction.

Bliss, now in Paris to attend the Inter-Allied Conference, has with him a staff of able men, including the president of the war college and representatives of each branch of the service.

These men will glean from the Allies the benefit of their experience and come back prepared to inject it into American "plans."

The American mission's part, however, will not be merely receptive. They bear "certain definite ideas from President Wilson."

The conference will be informed that despite the internal political discussion of America's war problem the nation is now going faster and more smoothly than at any time that it is prepared to do its utmost in men and supplies; and that it has its ordinance and quartermaster departments geared to a fresh efficiency under new leaders.

It Bliss voices the view among many American military men, he will inform the Allies that it is well to strike the German despite the latter's preponderance of men—not wait for him to accomplish his long-advertised offensive and meet it only defensively.

Meanwhile, Admiral Sims will be American representative on the Inter-Allied Naval Council.

Between the two men there must result a close working agreement for the United States and her Allies, military men say. Both are in the President's confidence and can speak with his authority behind them.

In Bliss's absence the work devolving on his position as chief of staff will be accomplished by other staff officials and the departmental war council.

RATIONS FOR ENGLAND SOON, RHONDDA WARNS

Food Controller Predicts Shortage of Meats and Fats Will Be Acute

LONDON, Jan. 25.—Lord Rhondda, food controller, in an address to the executive officers of the local food committee at Mansion House said that those at home engaged in the task of finding a solution for the present food difficulties were engaged in a task hardly second to that of the troops at the front. The scheme of rationing it was proposed to adopt, he added, would affect about one-fourth of the whole population of the country.

On February 25 he wanted them to commence rationing, not only with butter and margarine, but with meat. In the next few months there would be a great scarcity of meat, but after that "there would be an easing up."

Explaining his scheme of rationing in meat, which will apply to London and the home counties, Lord Rhondda said it was proposed to start with a ration of meat for adults and half a ration for children below six years.

The Ministry was trying to inaugurate similar schemes in South Wales and Scotland, and before long the whole country would be covered.

"The compulsory rationing of the whole country in fats and meats has to come," he said, "and the sooner it comes the better."

REDUCE FLOUR SALES TO GIVE ALLIES WHEAT

Food Administration Urges Substitutes, and Bread of Mixed Cereals Is Expected

WASHINGTON, Jan. 25

The food administration is considering a plan of forced reduction in flour sales to provide a large export surplus for the Allies. Millers, wholesalers, retailers and bakers probably will be required to hold their sales of flour down to 75 per cent of the amount now handled.

As the Allies are demanding from 75,000,000 to 100,000,000 more bushels of wheat, the food administration officials believe the United States can give

Europe 80,000,000 bushels of wheat made into flour between now and the time the new American crop comes in without endangering the American supply.

The plan, it is believed, will inevitably bring a war bread of mixed cereals to American tables. Although there is little sentiment for mixing flours at the mill a forced restriction of flour sales to dealers would bring milting in bakeries and in homes. Bakers who flour supplies are cut, food administration officials believe, will, of their own accord, substitute flours from other grains with mix flours or use a larger substitution, such as corn bread, rye bread and other breads.
