

400 SHELLMAKERS STRIKE IN CHESTER

Discharge of Workman Results in Tying Up Entire Plant

VIOLENCE IS FEARED

Employees Declare They Will Picket Works Despite Sheriff's Warning

Chester, Pa., April 26.

Four hundred workers at the Thurlow Steel Works struck yesterday after one of the men had been discharged by John P. Curley, manager of the plant.

There has been no violence, but the strikers defied Sheriff Grainger when he warned them against picketing. They said they would picket the plant today in order to prevent the return to work of any of their number.

Sheriff Grainger informed the strikers that he would station state troopers, deputy sheriffs, the city mounted squad and patrolmen around the plant this morning, and if any attempt was made to picket every striker would be arrested.

According to the management of the steel works, one of the workers was discharged Tuesday afternoon, the last of his time. Part of the time was lost on account of illness and the other part, it is alleged, in order to prevent men from turning out 100 per cent of product.

About two months ago the entire force was out for several days. A satisfactory agreement was reached at that time after Major Tulley was detailed here by the War Department and made an investigation.

The workers, at a meeting, voted to stand firm until an agent of the War Department is detailed here to meet them. Not a wheel in the plant turned yesterday.

Allentown Man Told Mormonism Will Not Be Tolerated



Pittsburgh, April 26.—Mystery surrounding recent fires in the Prospect and Whittier public schools here has been cleared by a confession by John Freyvogel, former candidate for Mayor on a nonpartisan ticket, following his arrest by city detectives.

Touring Car and Truck Add to Loss From Country Fire

Woodbury, N. J., April 26.—Five automobiles after he had driven his big truck into his garage, Samuel H. Savage, a farmer on the South Woodbury, near Haverhill, saw flames rising from the building. Savage and his men got out all the livestock from the barn and out buildings.

The garage, which also contained a new touring car, the barn wagon shed, chicken house and other buildings, was destroyed, together with a quantity of corn and fertilizer and a pile of coal.

DRAFT COMPLAINTS LAID TO POLITICS

Governor May Ask Removal of Crowder's Aide From State Headquarters

Harrisburg, April 26.

Major Charles B. Warren, of Probst, Marshal General Crowder's aide, expected here yesterday to investigate conditions in the Pennsylvania system of handling the draft, has left word here he would not come until later.

It is understood that Governor Brumbaugh will ask for the withdrawal of Lieutenant J. J. Mackay, sent here from General Crowder's office to supervise the draft work at State headquarters. The State Administration, it is said, holds that Mackay, a southern Democrat, was put here for political purposes and to aid and abet with the way the draft is being handled by boards, a majority of whose members are Republicans.

Adjutant General Henry, who has just returned from Washington, said in a statement: "In reference to the dispatch from Washington, complaining of certain conditions in the State selective service headquarters, the adjutant general has no statement to make beyond drawing attention to the fact that the entire quota so far required by the provost marshal general from Pennsylvania has been furnished, and without any fiction or delay. It is customary to judge work by results."

Twenty-two special trains will be required to move the men drafted for the National Army from Pennsylvania to the three camps to which the State is tributary in the movement, which will start tomorrow and close on April 30, according to the adjutant general's department. This will be the largest number of trains required under any call, and more than 10,000 men will be moved. The movements to Columbus barracks and Fort Thomas are entirely separate.

Sixteen trains will be run to Camp Lee, taking men from all over the State, beginning today. One train will be run to Camp Sherman from western counties tomorrow, but there will be three trains for white men for Camp Meade and two for colored men for the same camp.

Second A. L. L. of New Freedom, York County, who holds a State record for the large number of appeals he took before the local draft board and the district board, has been eliminated from Camp Meade for the quota allotment. The reason is not known by the district board here, which was notified but the exemption board the first draft came after. L. L. had made up his mind that he was going to France.
