There could be no better object lesson of military discipline, training and tradition than that furnished by the unit which I made today to the colonel of the Foreign Legion.

I was received beforehand by the general commanding the famous Moroccan division in which the legion has been incorporated. He is well worthy to lead the bravest of the brave, for his war-cross ribbon bears more palms—six of them—than any other soldier in the world.

Like him, the colonel of the legion has fully earned the right to lead the first regiment in the French army to wear the black beret which indicates a veteran.

Before describing the action in which his regiment took part the colonel remarked that the legion was a living response to President Wilson's appeal.

The answer is simple. Discipline, the practice of war since its foundation the legion has been making war equally and conditions of exceptional difficulty.

The officers and non-commissioned officers of the legion had been in the fiercest of the fiercest of schools. In the flame of the Artois battle of May 9, 1915—our first engagement in this war, in which 50,000 men and horses were equally great—their discipline and their courage were put to the test.


