


SCENES AND FIGURES FAMILIAR TO PHILADELPHIANS BUT SELDOM SEEN IN PHOTOGRAPHS



THE VISITOR'S INTRODUCTION to Philadelphia is the skyline view directly above with the mouth of the Pennsylvania terminal yawning in the left foreground. To the right, the Cathedral looks out upon scenes of disorder in Logan Square, where the Parkway has been given the right of way.
