

# SHIP EMPLOYERS TO MEET AT SHORE

Each of Nine Yards on Delaware to Be Represented at Convention Opening Friday

## TO URGE AID FOR SOLDIERS

Employment department heads responsible for maintaining working forces totaling more than 200,000 employees in the shipyards of the Atlantic seaboard will gather in Atlantic City on Friday for the annual meeting of the employment managers' committee of the Atlantic Coast Shipbuilders' Association. Shipyard executives are co-operating to make the gathering a notable one, and it is expected several hundred representatives of shipbuilding interests throughout the country will attend.

Each of the nine shipyards of the Delaware river district will send delegations to the meeting, and Philadelphia will be prominent in the program. Clarence Samuel King, Philadelphia manager of the Atlantic Coast Shipbuilders' Association, who is also secretary of the employment managers' committee, announced that many acceptances have been received from executives and employment managers of the Great Lakes, South Atlantic and Gulf shipyards who had been invited to attend the sessions.

W. G. Coxe to Preside

William G. Coxe, president of the association, will preside at the opening session. Numbered among the shipyard executives who will address the meeting are: Matthew C. Brush, president American International Shipbuilding Corporation, who will speak on "The Relations of the Employment Department to Management"; Holden A. Evans, president Baltimore Dry Docks and Shipbuilding Company, whose subject is "Relations of the Employment Department to Shop Personnel," and Antonio C. Pessano, chairman of the boards of directors of the Great Lakes Engineering Works and the Downey Shipbuilding Corporation, who will discuss "Stabilizing the Working Force."

R. H. M. Robinson, president of the Merchant Shipbuilding Corporation and the Chester Shipbuilding Company, will speak on "The Relations of the Employment Department to Industrial Rela-

tions." Edwin C. Bennett, vice president and general manager of the Newburgh Shipyards, Inc., will discuss "The Labor Situation." Other speakers will include Colonel Arthur Woods, special assistant to the secretary of war, whose subject is "Placement of Returning Soldiers, Sailors and Marines," and Dr. C. A. Prosser, director of the federal board for vocational education, who will talk on "Financing Vocational Education."

Parker, Fore River plant, Bethlehem Shipbuilding Corporation; "Physical Examinations," James E. Neary, Standard Shipbuilding Corporation; "Statistics," M. E. Hood, Chester Shipbuilding Company; "Adjustments," R. W. Aitken, American International Shipbuilding Corporation; "Non-Resident Aliens," W. S. Wells, Newburgh Shipyards, Inc.; "Employee Stockholders," J. G. Quinn, Downey Shipbuilding Corporation; "Insurance," Harry R. Humphreys, New York Shipbuilding Corporation; "Safety and First Aid," E. J. Robeson, Newport News Shipbuilding and Dry Dock Company; "Yard Publications," John L. Collyer, Bethlehem Shipbuilding Corporation, and "Labor Supply," Paul Gendall, New York Shipbuilding Corporation.

Open sessions of the conference will be held both morning and afternoon, beginning at 9:30 a. m. and 2 p. m., respectively, in the roof garden of the Breakers Hotel, where an informal banquet will also take place in the evening at 7:30 o'clock. The business session will begin at 5 p. m.
