

GIVES HER BLOOD TO SAVE COUSIN

Mrs. Emma Smith, of Germantown, Recovering After Successful Transfusion

KINSMAN VICTIM OF GAS

A woman, submitting to the operation of blood transfusion, saved the life today of Dennis McGee when he was apparently at the point of death from illuminating gas poisoning at the Germantown Hospital.

McGee, who was a helper in Cramp's shipyard, suffered a nervous breakdown several weeks ago. Yesterday evening he was found lying unconscious on the floor of the bathroom at 473 East Penn street, where he lived, by another cousin, Miss Nellie Shortle, and Arthur Smith, husband of the woman who gave her blood to save his life.

At the Germantown Hospital it was decided that blood transfusion was the only way to save McGee. Smith offered his blood, but when tested it was found to be not of the desired quality. Then Mrs. Smith gave six ounces of blood.

CHANGE IN GROVE LINE

Routes 49 and 56 to Be Consolidated on Sunday

Consolidation of the Glenside and Erie avenue lines, Routes 49 and 56, effective Sunday, September 28, is announced by the P. R. T. as a step in line with the plans of President Mitten for economies of operation.

New schedules have also been prepared for Routes 2 and 50, also effective Sunday, September 28. Route 2 cars will start from Fifteenth street and Erie avenue, instead of from Eleventh street, and will terminate at Porter street at night, running to the navy yard only during the day.

SAVES CANOEISTS' LIVES

Power Works Engineer Stops Turbine Into Which They Were Drifting. Quick work on the part of Harry Morgan, engineer in the power works on the Manayunk canal near du Pont street, saved the lives of two canoeists who were drawn in toward a huge turbine wheel late yesterday afternoon.

Morgan saw the canoe and immediately shut off the power. Within a few feet of a wheel the canoe drifted to a stop and Morgan pointed the way to paddle to safety.
