

**FEARS OF EJECTION
DELAY COAL BUYING**

**Dealers Say Tenants Hesitate
to Put in Fuel They May
Have to Move**

Thousands of families in Philadelphia have not ordered their winter's supply of coal yet because of fear they will be ejected by profiteering landlords. This was made known after a canvass of the retail coal yards of the city. The coal dealers say that many patrons are withholding orders now because they fear if they get the coal they will have to move when landlords begin expected proceedings to collect rent increases. "Philose publicity" is one method suggested by William I. Schaffer, state attorney general, to combat the rent-

gouging evil. The publication of the name and address of each dealer and owner who profiteers and the extent of his gouging was a method suggested by Mr. Schaffer. Counsel for the Philadelphia Real Estate Board and the tenants will meet today in an effort to work out some just form of universal lease.

MORE ARMY FOOD ARRIVES

Lansdowne Residents Will Benefit From Cut-Price Sale
The first carload of government food-stuffs to be sold at cheap prices beginning Monday morning at the grocery store of Hoaty Brothers, 25 South Lansdowne street, Lansdowne, arrived there today.

Three or four carloads will be received in all and a variety of goods including beans, tomatoes, canned goods, bacon and ham will be sold. The sale will be conducted by volunteers from the Emergency Aid, the Red Cross and the Centres Club of Lansdowne.

CAMPAIGN EXPENSES LOW

Accounts Filed by Several Candidates Show Small Expenditures

Wacker, defeated for the nomination for the Municipal Court, filed an account of \$100.50. Accounts showing expenditures of less than \$50 were filed by Robert E. Lamberton, Republican nominee for sheriff; Robert Birchall, nominee for magistrate, and Edwin R. Cox, Frank Gray, Clarence S. Eldridge and Edward Buchholz, candidates for Council.

BELGIAN KING TO VISIT HERE

Will Spend Few Hours in City During Visit to This Country
King Albert and Queen Elizabeth, of Belgium, will spend a few hours in this city when they visit this country. Mayor Smith has extended the invitation to the royal couple. The Mayor has been advised from Washington, however, that owing to the brief stay of the visitors in this country, their stop in this city must be very short, but that the visit will positively be made.

It is planned to have a citizens' reception committee meet the Belgian king and queen and their suite, if the invitation is accepted, and conduct them to Independence Hall and other points of interest in the city.

UPSET LAMP BURNS CHILD

While his mother was away, Johnnie Bishel, three years old, upset a lamp in the kitchen of his home at Swanson and Queen streets, early today and was badly burned. The child is a serious condition at Mt. Sinai Hospital. Neighbors heard the little boy's cries and ran into the house. They put out the flames and took the child to the hospital.

U. S. to Sell Surplus Steel

Manufacturers here who use steel in making their products will be offered an opportunity to buy 11,000,000 pounds of steel from the government, it was learned today through a dispatch from Washington. The steel will be offered for sale by the War Department through district ordinance offices at Philadelphia and Boston between October 1 and October 9. The metal to be disposed of ranges from finished steel armor plate to unfinished trench helmets.

PLAN DE VALERA RECEPTION

Will Hold Open-Air Meeting Before Metropolitan Opera House
So many requests for tickets to hear President de Valera, of the "Irish Republic," speak when he comes to Philadelphia on October 1, have been received, that a great outdoor meeting, in addition to the one in the Metropolitan Opera House, has already been arranged for. The meeting will take place in front of the opera house shortly after 8 o'clock. When De Valera reaches the playhouse, he will speak to the outdoor gathering before going indoors. Then when he comes out, he may make another address to the renewed gathering on the street. A special stand will be erected for the speaker on the corner. De Valera will reach North Philadelphia about noon on October 1, and will establish headquarters in the Bellevue-Stratford.
