

Gary Placed Under Military Control

no public meetings or assemblages be held and forbidding parades and demonstrations against the authorities.

Following the action of several secret men wearing the uniform of the United States army in leading the parade against orders of the mayor and police yesterday.

It was made plain that martial law had not been declared. The federal troops, it was stated by a member of General Wood's staff, will be used to preserve order.

Immediately upon their arrival here the soldiers began patrolling, and early today Gary showed no indications of disorder.

The troops wore steel helmets, but did not walk their posts with fixed bayonets.

Ample reserve forces were on hand, it was stated, to check almost any outbreak, no matter how extensive.

No Interference With Strike
Picketing by the strikers at various plants will not be stopped.

General Wood preceded the troops by several hours. One of his first actions here was to call a conference of city officials and strike leaders.

Mayor Hodges shortly after noon yesterday realized the situation was becoming so critical that the state troops on the job were inadequate.

Mob of 5000 Forms
The former soldiers became the nucleus of a mob of about 5000 strikers, who organized in parade formation and marched through the city.

These prisoners, including one Gary Alderman, are held on the second floor of the courthouse at Crown Point.

STRIKE TO CONTINUE. SAY BETHLEHEM MEN

HELFFERICH BRIEF IN COURT
Magistrates Take Papers in Complaint Made by Erzberger
Berlin, Oct. 7.—(By A. P.)—The brief in the case resulting from complaints made by Matthias Erzberger, vice premier and minister of finance, against Dr. Carl Helfferich, former imperial vice chancellor, has been forwarded to the magistrates sitting in the case.

Exact details of the charges made against Dr. Helfferich have not been made public, but it is believed they refer to his activities while in office. It was reported on September 11 the case against the former vice chancellor would be tried by a state tribunal.

"We will draft here a declaration of dependence, not of independence; a declaration that we are united one with another, that we live in one another's breath, and that we cannot live in isolation; that we must join hands to either not for our sake alone, but for the greater sake of our country and of the world."

Nomination of Mr. Lane as chairman of the meeting was made by Frank Morrison, secretary of the American Federation of Labor and chairman of the nominations committee.

HOOVER FEARS RADICALISM
Predicts Dire Results if Teachers Aren't Better Paid
San Francisco, Oct. 7.—(By A. P.)—Warning that unless better pay is forthcoming for teachers in American colleges the nation will be face to face with a dangerous radicalism from the centers of higher education, was voiced by Herbert Hoover, former federal food administrator, in an address before the Harvard Club of California here last night.

"Out of the war and misery of the war has risen a silhouette of class distinction and class hatred that is not to be obliterated with a few words," Mr. Hoover said.

"The development of radicalism in Europe during the last twelve months is beyond anything in history. America is a fertile field and responds quickly to any wind that may blow. This European wind of radicalism is sweeping our way and it is affecting us."

Encouraging Bolshevism

Everything that falsely encourages unrest also encourages bolshevism. Misunderstanding of American industrial organization, and of its benefits to mankind, leads to unrest, dissatisfaction, and radicalism.

For example, the Federal Trade Commission tells the public that the large packers had an agreed price for lard substitute (made of cotton-seed oil). It reproduces letters taken from the files of one of the packers, showing that such agreed price existed.

But it failed to mention that the agreed price was determined at the request of and in co-operation with the Food Administration!

Even the Department of Justice, in its unjust attempt to create prejudice against the packers, has made public these same letters, with no explanation. How long must this kind of misrepresentation continue? In so far as it is believed, it not only breeds discontent, but results in injustice to our industry.
