U. S. TROOPS REACH BROWNSVILLE, PA.

Brownsville, Pa., Nov. 4.—(By A. P.)—United States troops entered Pennsylvania on strike duty today when a company of infantry arrived here from Buffalo.

Troops numbering 180, in command of Colonel E. D. Evans, arrived from Fort Niagara early in the day.

Brownsville is on the Monongahela river, the center of an important mining field, with about forty mines.

Many mines are closed by the strike, but an almost equal number not controlled by the United Mine Workers are to be kept in operation.

Pittsburgh, Nov. 4.—(By A. P.)—Record breaking coal production in non-union mines in the Pittsburgh district was reported today by operators.

Denver, Col., Nov. 4.—(By A. P.)—Reports received at the offices of the

Colorado Fuel and Iron Co. here today indicated an increase in the number of men working in company mines.

At Walsburg, near Walsenburg, where troops were dispatched late yesterday 186 men were working today.

PLAN TO REOPEN W. VA. MINES SOON

Charleston, W. Va., Nov. 4.—(By A. P.)—Operators of West Virginia coal districts affected by the strike met today to consider issuing a public invitation to all striking miners to return to work.

No desertions were reported in other coal regions, and union leaders are confident the men will stand firm.

The New River Coal Operators' Association has been called to meet here next week to discuss plans for the reopening of all mines in the district.

Reports from non-union Guyan district operators said, showed increased production today over that of yesterday.

Efforts to operate the non-union mines

in the Morgantown region met with no success, but in the neighboring county of Preston, production was normal with all mines open.

COAL MINERS FIRM; MORE SOLDIERS OUT

Chicago, Nov. 4.—(By A. P.)—In the face of virtually an unbroken front of approximately 425,000 striking coal miners, whose walkout throughout the nation at midnight Friday night has produced almost complete paralysis of the production of bituminous coal.

Additional movements of federal and state troops into various coal fields were reported over night, and thousands of carloads of fuel in transit were cancelled by the federal railroad administration.

Non-union miners in Pennsylvania have continued on their job getting out an appreciable amount of fuel.

Indianapolis, Ind., Nov. 4.—(By A. P.)—With officials of the United Mine Workers of America maintaining an attitude of "nothing to say," as a result of the Federal court restraining order.

Attorneys for the miners continued preparation today of their side of the case preparatory to the hearing next Saturday in federal court of the injunction proceedings and Washington officials were of the opinion that the broad powers of the restraining order prohibiting use of the strike funds

would compel the miners to resume work. McKinley and Colfax counties, New Mexico, today were added to the districts under military control by a martial law proclamation of Governor Larrazola.

Additional troops for possible duty in the extensive Pennsylvania fields were under orders today to be ready to entrain at two hours' notice.

Military control was established in all the northern Wyoming coal camps, but an announced civil officers would continue to function.

Non-union miners in Pennsylvania have continued on their job getting out an appreciable amount of fuel.

Attorneys for both are at work preparing their sides of the case, which, in addition to the question of whether a temporary injunction is issued, involves a petition that the miners' officials be enjoined to cancel the strike order.

The government's case here is in the hands of Dan W. Sims, of Lafayette, who was appointed special district attorney on account of the mass of regular court work with which District Attorney L. Ert Slack is occupied.

COMMISSION TO END STRIKE OF MINERS



Washington, Nov. 4.—The coal strike is likely to end this week. Steps are being taken for the appointment of a commission similar to the commission appointed by President Roosevelt to end the anthracite strike several years ago.

Attorney General Palmer had conferences yesterday with Mr. Gompers, chief of the American Federation of Labor, and with Mr. Stone, the chief of the Brotherhood of Engineers.

The procedure in this case is likely to follow the line of Mr. Stone's suggestion, except that a special commission is likely to be named to deal with the present dispute.

If the present plans go through, the attorney general will ask next Saturday that the writ of injunction be vacated by the court at Philadelphia.
