

7 MEXICAN TOWNS EFFACED BY QUAKE

Lake Covers Their Former Sites, Is Report—Other Communities Destroyed by Eruption

DEATH TOLL NEAR 2000

By the Associated Press. Mexico City, Jan. 9.—Seven towns near Teocelo, south of Jalisco, have been overwhelmed by the earth disturbances and a great lake is covering their former sites, according to a message received this morning from Teocelo through Vera Cruz.

Thirty-four bodies had been recovered when the message was filed. The towns that were inundated are Tlatanalán, Quizezmitán, Constañela, Tozigue, Xochitlán, Choloza and San José Achiolotlán.

Every house in Teocelo has been made uninhabitable. It seems improbable the final list of casualties in last Saturday's earthquake and the new eruption will fall below original estimates of 2000, even if reports of 1000 deaths at Constanza were exaggerated.

There has been an attempt to estimate the number of houses destroyed by the shock, nor has figures as to the number of injured or property damage been reported. With the water supply of various places polluted by volcanic action, the first action taken was to send tank cars filled with fresh water to the suffering districts.

Following an appeal by Colonel Chantlino Fontes, general manager of the National Railways, who asked that the employees contribute one day's pay to the earthquake relief fund, it was said more than 200,000 pesos would be subscribed within a few days.

ROBBERS KILL MERCHANT

Bound to Post and Burned to Death Following Looting. Osceola, Ark., Jan. 9.—W. E. Hansel, owner of a chain of plantation stores, was bound to a post and burned to death by robbers, who looted his store at Holt, near here. Hansel's clothing had been saturated with gasoline. The store also was set on fire. Farmers, roused by a negro, who discovered the building in flames, tried to rescue Hansel, but he was killed by the robbers with his clothing afire and his face seared by the blaze.

BRITISH RAIL OFFER FAILING

Workers Expected to Reject Government Wage Proposal Today. London, Jan. 9.—(By A. P.)—The opinion prevailed at headquarters of the union of railway workers that the union representatives, who have been deliberating on the government's wage offer since Wednesday would conclude their discussions today and adopt a resolution rejecting the proposals. It was expected, however, that a way would be left open for negotiations with the government on contested points, and it was said that there was little likelihood that the union at this time would take any extreme action.

'WHITE TERROR' IN HUNGARY

More Than 5000 on Reactionary Death List, Communist Writes. Bern, Jan. 9.—(By A. P.)—The Socialist Tagblatt prints a letter written by a Hungarian communist leader, who declares that wild reaction rages throughout Hungary. The writer says that while during the 'Red Terror' of last spring only 204 persons were killed the existing 'White Terror' has a death list of more than 5000. In addition to some 15,000 persons arrested, 4000 Socialist families are being kept in notorious concentration camps which constantly are ravaged by epidemics, it is claimed.

SEEK TACTFUL WAY TO EXPEL TURKEY

Allies Would Oust 'Sick Man of Europe' Without Offending Islamic World

DESPAIR OF U. S. MANDATE

By the Associated Press. Washington, Jan. 9.—Abandoning hope that the United States could be induced to accept a mandate over Turkey, the allied powers are in correspondence with a view to facilitating some solution of the problem of expelling the Turks from Europe without causing such an uprising among the Mohammedan people as would endanger the control of the European nations over them.

Information reaching Washington is that these efforts are in progress outside of Paris, where the Supreme Council is sitting, though it is expected that the ratification of that body will be required to give effect to any plans adopted. Reports from India, Egypt and other Mohammedan countries of a general objection to the expulsion of the Turks from Europe and insistence upon the retention of the head of their church in Constantinople, under threats of boycott of Christian business and trade, even among the allies, have stimulated endeavors of the Entente foreign offices to find some plan which will satisfy the Musselmans and at the same time free Constantinople from Turkish misadministration.

One such project which seems to afford a basis for action contemplates the assumption of the control of Constantinople by the league of nations. This would include the declaration of the city as a free port and the actual administration of the place by a commission nominated by the Mohammedan population of countries and colonies such as India, Egypt, Tunis, Morocco and possibly the Malays of the Philippines. If the United States can be induced to participate in such an action, it is proposed to give this commission full powers to control Constantinople politically and to administer the local government. But to satisfy the demand of the allies and this suite would be permitted to reside there and to exercise from there all of the functions of the head of his church. This position would, therefore, in some measure correspond to that of the Pope in Rome after he had been divested of his temporal powers.

'COMEZ UPHELD IN CUBA

Legality of Liberal National Assembly is Sustained. Havana, Jan. 9.—According to published statements, the Supreme Court has sustained the decision of the central electoral board, upholding the legality of the liberal national assembly, which, in May, nominated former President Jose Miguel Gomez, as the party's presidential candidate for 1920.

Winnipeg Plans Air Route

Winnipeg, Jan. 9.—An aerial service between Winnipeg and St. Paul will be established this summer, it was announced yesterday. One of the stations will be at Grand Forks, which will be reached in ninety minutes from this city.

Profiteering Merchants Fined

Lisbon, Jan. 9.—A number of shopkeepers who were charged with asking excessive prices for food yesterday were fined from 500 to 1000 escudos. (The normal value of the escudo in American money is about fifty cents.)

Bolshevik Forces Enter Bokhara, Within 200 Miles of Afghanistan Frontier

TO RE-ENFORCE DENKINE

By the Associated Press. London, Jan. 9.—Bokhara, capital of the important Khanate of Bokhara, in Central Asia, and less than 200 miles from the Afghanistan frontier, has been entered by Bolshevik forces, according to War Office reports. Further west, soviet troops have occupied Krasnovodsk on the eastern shore of the Caspian sea, Moscow reports. It is asserted here that the Bolsheviks have as their ulterior purpose an offensive against the British, and plan important movements in the direction of India in conjunction with the Afghans and other peoples who might be influenced by Pan-Islamic aspirations.

For this purpose swarms of propaganda agents are said to be undergoing intensive training and many have been sent into Persia and the Caucasus, being provided with large supplies of forged English money. bodies of troops in Turkistan with a view to carrying out possibly far-reaching plans westward toward the Caspian region and southward toward Persia and Afghanistan, it is said. Soviet authorities have announced their intention to penetrate Persia by way of Khorassan as soon as they could secure control of the Caspian sea. Recent reports indicated that soviet garrisons along the Khorassan frontier had been heavily re-enforced. It is reported 1500 soviet agents have gone into Persia from Georgia and Azerbaijan. Anti-Bolshevik authorities have taken steps to put a stop to this movement.

Rome, Jan. 9.—(By A. P.)—The Epoca says that Nicolai Lenine has written another letter to the directors of the Socialist party imploring them not to precipitate revolutionary movement which in the present conditions would have no probability of success. Lenine adds that a revolution in Italy now would be a boomerang for the Russian soviet republic, which is about to negotiate with the bourgeois powers for the acknowledgment of the present state of affairs in Russia and also for essential economic agreements. All this would be rejected, says Lenine, if a revolution occurred in Italy, because with the eventual spread of bolshevism throughout Europe, the states still immune from bolshevism would hermetically close themselves against infection. The soviet republic, destined to become a type for the future, might not have time to strengthen itself sufficiently to become vital, according to Lenine.
