U. S. INTERVENTION URGED IN MEXICO
E. F. Harvey, Philadelphian, Says Move Is Needed for Both Countries' Welfare

SPENT 12 YEARS THERE
Only the intervention of the United States in the Mexican situation of a competent head of that nation, installed by ballot instead of by force, will prevent Mexico from losing the society of nations.

This statement was made today by Edward F. Harvey, who has just returned from Mexico, where he spent twelve years. He expressed his views on the Mexican tangle before a Senate subcommittee investigating Mexican affairs, yesterday.

"Unless intervention by this country in Mexico is carried out in the proper manner, the United States will only succeed in incurring the enmity of all the Mexican people," he said, "but if the movement is carried on properly, it will crystallize their opinions for good and in our favor."

Forms of Intervention
"There is one form of intervention which may have a disastrous effect and there is another which may result in peaceful and most desirable relations between this country and our neighbor to the south of us.

"If we intervene in such a way that the people of Mexico will be convinced that we are doing so for no other purpose than to give them a free and safe government, a self-government by peaceful votes, then our advent into that country will be welcomed by the majority of the people."

"Mexico is facing a crisis now. The

feature of the association's plan that consists of the grouping of the art institutions of the city around the great plaza at the upper end of the Parkway has received the approval of the authorities, and definite assignments of spacious sites for the Academy of the Fine Arts, the Pennsylvania Museum and School of Industrial Art and the Johnson Gallery have already been made.

The attack, delivered at a luncheon in the Belmont Hotel, followed presentation of the art association's forty-eighth annual report. Progress on the Parkway and the art plans of the city were reviewed and commented in the report and improvement of the Schuylkill river embankments was urged.

Mr. Pinchot's address follows: "The Pennsylvania Department of Forestry is the most inefficient body of its kind within my knowledge. It has never made an effort to use the most powerful weapon against forest fires ever put into the hands of a forest department in the United States—the law of June 3, 1919."

Fine Ice Provided
"This law provides a fine of \$100 a day for any man who refuses to comply with the department's directions as to keeping his forestland reasonably safe against fire. Efficient stamping out of forest fires in Pennsylvania.

"The present head of the department has been in the habit of making timber sales on the state forests contrary to law without the authority of the forest commission, and under these sales the state forests are now being devastated by destructive lumbering under the name of forestry."

"Under the present management of the department forestry has been discontinued but not practiced. The only thing that could be done is the reorganization of the department and the substitution of trained practical foresters for the present incompetents."
