

ASSERTS AMERICA BETRAYS WOMEN

Mrs. Catt, at Geneva Congress, Deplores U. S. Failure to Grant Suffrage

SERMON OPENS SESSIONS

By the Associated Press. Geneva, June 7.—The eighth congress of the international woman suffrage alliance was opened yesterday with a sermon delivered in Geneva Cathedral, by Miss Maud Royden, formerly pastor of the City Temple in London.

Miss Royden's frail figure in black seemed lost in the great pulpit from which she preached. The local authorities were present in full strength in the cathedral, which was crowded. A touch of color was lent by ten Indian women delegates in their costumes of many hues.

There must be millions of women in Europe, she said, "who never hoped for political liberty and who are now dashed by its sudden coming. It is not for me to interpret the sentiments of the women of other lands, but with authority I may say there are millions of suffragists in the United States who have been fairly stupefied with astonishment at these almost unaccountable events. As all the world knows, the United States of America has been elected from the first to the principle of self-government. No other nation has made the same pronouncements.

No other country has repudiated its constitution, principles and history in its denial of votes to its women, and that is why the extension of suffrage to the women of all Europe has so humiliated the women of the United States. Women of the United States are not less glad that women of other lands have won the vote, but they feel that they have been betrayed by their own nation."

BRITISH SHIPS FIRE ON TURKISH REBELS

Constantinople Is Aroused by Booming of Guns in Sea of Marmora

SULTAN'S TROOPS FAIL

By the Associated Press. Constantinople, June 7.—British warships opened fire on Nationalist positions near Tonzola, on the Sea of Marmora, thirty-eight miles west of Ismid, on Friday night. Constantinople was aroused by the heavy firing of the guns of the warships. The Nationalists had approached close to the British trenches along the Gulf of Ismid, where many British units are stationed to protect the troops guarding the railway.

The collapse of the sultan's troops leaves the British alone to defend the railway terminals opposite Constantinople. Many Armenian and Greek refugees have entered Ismid after escaping from the Nationalists. It is reported that the Turks captured Bozanti, north of Adana, (Cilicia) on May 30, taking prisoner a large number of French. The Turks are free to turn their entire strength in that area against Adana, Taurus and Mersin, but say they do not want to take these towns lest they incur the ill-will of the British and Americans.

The government has received a note from the Allies granting the Turks a delay of fifteen days in which to present their observations on the peace terms. Turkey had asked an extension until July 11 in which to submit an answer.

"Turkey cannot live five years if the treaty is enforced as it stands," Damad Ferid Pasha, premier and brother-in-law of the sultan, told the correspondent today.

"Constantinople will die, for no great city can live without a hinterland," the premier said.
