DEFEAT OF WILSON IS SEEN BY BRITISH

"Story is One of Most Pitiful of All Failures," Comments Manchester Guardian

FRENCH PRESS FAVORABLE

London, Nov. 4.—In its comment today on the United States presidential election, the Manchester Guardian says: "The main political motive for the electors' choice is, by general assent, accumulated dislike of Wilsonism and not love of Harding and his party. . . . The national repudiation marks a tragic change from those weeks in the autumn of 1918, when the material power of America was deciding the world war and her foremost mind was leading the world toward such a peace as might have given us a tranquil, swiftly convalescent world instead of the present world's fair of spites, greeds and suspicions between nations and dissensions inside each of them. The world, soiled and darkened by international politics seemed to be on the eve of redemption on the day when the news came that Germany would surrender on the basis of Wilson's fourteen points. . . . In what proportions a want of dynamic genius in President Wilson and an irredeemable viciousness of spirit in other politicians contributed to darken that opening prospect we cannot tell yet. It is gone now. Europe is snarling and jabbing and loeking in the old slime, while all the remaining effect of Wilsonism in America is the decision of the presidential election by an overwhelming balance of public antipathy to it. The story is that of one of the most pitiful of all failures in the execution of a task nobly conceived."

WOMEN VOTE CAREFULLY

Mrs. M. W. Park Pleased at Splendid Showing They Made

New York, Nov. 4.—Mrs. Maul Wood Park, chairman of the National League of Women Voters, in a statement issued here yesterday, said: "Women were a vital factor in the election returns which made political history for the United States. . . . Without clogging the election machinery they added the largest intelligent electorate this nation has ever assembled at one time. . . . The women of America voted early, quickly, thoughtfully and with definite sense of responsibility. . . . The casting of their ballots on Tuesday was not an end in itself. It was just the beginning of their usefulness as citizens."

TEN SCOTCH TOWNS DRY

Thirty-six Ballot Against Change in Licenses

Glasgow, Nov. 4.—Incomplete returns of the voting on the liquor question in Scotland Tuesday show that thirty-six towns desire no change in the present law which permits the sale of liquor. One town voted in favor of a reduction in licenses, while ten towns voted dry. . . . ["Dry" in the Scotch election means no licenses except in the cases of restaurants and hotels.] Official results in Glasgow of the liquor option poll show a victory for the "wets." Four wards voted "dry," nine for limited licenses and twenty-four for no change, which means that ninety-four licenses will be cancelled throughout the city out of a total of 1000. In Dennistown prohibition was defeated by four votes. Virtually all the working class areas remain "wets," and also the central city districts.

PLAN TO TIGHTEN SCREWS

Washington, Nov. 4.—"We are absolutely satisfied the next Congress will be dry," Captain F. B. Ebbert, associate general counsel for the Anti-Saloon League of America, declared today. . . . Wayne B. Wheeler, general counsel for the league and its official spokesman, left last night for Westerville, O., the league's headquarters, to receive reports from all congressional districts where the drys had made a fight. Before he left he expressed thorough satisfaction with the returns received up to that time. . . . Captain Ebbert asserted the prohibition majority in both House and Senate would probably be increased as a result of the election. . . . "There is no question as to the complexion of the next Congress," he said. "It is safely dry, and we look for a substantial increase in the dry majorities. There is no question what."

COOLIDGE BELIEVES SOUTH IS WAVERING

Vice President-Elect Sees Indication of Breaking Away From Prejudices of Years

Boston, Nov. 4.—Governor Coolidge, vice president-elect, last night said one of the gratifying results of the election "has been the nation-wide support of the 'let'."

"While, of course, most of the southern states have been carried by the Democratic party," he added, "Republican strength in that section has so increased as to indicate the breaking away from the former prejudices that ruled there for many years. . . . There is nowhere that the American spirit is so strong as in the border and southern states. If we can eliminate the sectional feeling that has so long prevailed, those states will vote the Republican ticket. They are against every form of radicalism and their attachment to constitutional government is overpowering. . . . This evening Governor and Mrs. Coolidge will be given a reception at the University Club in this city. Both will attend a reception by the citizens of Northampton, their home city, on Friday evening."

SUFFRAGE HERO WINS

Young Tennesseean Returned to Legislature by Close Vote

Athens, Tenn., Nov. 4.—Harry T. Burn, Republican member of the State Assembly from this county, and who cast the deciding vote for the ratification of the suffrage amendment by Tennessee, has been re-elected after a bitter contest, his majority being about 1100.

CABINET INTERESTS BRITISH

London Daily News for Appointment of Root and Hoover

London, Nov. 4.—The Daily News in an editorial expresses the opinion that the composition of President Harding's cabinet will be more important for England than Mr. Harding's election. . . . "The appointment of Herbert Hoover and Elihu Root, whose names are mentioned," says the paper, "would be viewed here with unqualified satisfaction."

WILSON'S CABINET DAZED

Only Two Members Express Opinion of Result

Washington, Nov. 4.—Silence, verging on unconsciousness, characterized the White House and the members of the President's official family when the full effect of the Republican victory became apparent even to those ardent Democratic supporters who Tuesday night were still making the reservation, in the face of a flood of Harding ballots, that "the West may turn the tide." . . . There was no "Lochinvar in 1920, however, to unite the Democratic party to public office for four more years, and consequently the ranking Democrats left in the capital were very much in the position of Newton D. Baker, secretary of war, who acknowledged frankly he could not account for the result except that it "seemed every man, woman and child had voted wrong."
