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MINERS TO CONFER WITH OPERATORS

Anthracite Men's General Scale Committee to Meet Employers Here Today

HOPE TO AGREE ON WAGE

An attempt to adjust inequalities and injustices in the present wage agreement between the anthracite mine workers and the coal operators will be made when a subcommittee of the miners will meet with the employers in this city today.

Thomas Kennedy, chairman of the workers' committee, said yesterday that none of the demands of the hard coal miners for additional wage increases will be dropped, but that an effort will be made to have the operators consider them as a part of the "existing inequalities."

Far Hills, N. J., Dec. 29.—A New Jersey cow again holds the world's butterfat record. She is Snowdrop, a pure-bred Shorthorn, owned by William Gelschenen, of the Sherwoods Farms, near Far Hills. In one year she has produced 15,550 pounds of milk, containing 691 pounds of butterfat.

London, Dec. 29.—A movement calculated by its organizers to place the full weight of British organized labor in support of the Irish self-determination claims began with a specially convened conference of the Parliamentary Labor party in London today, after which several members of the party's commission which investigated the situation in Ireland told of what they had observed and heard there.

A resolution was adopted, unanimously challenging the government to disprove the commission's accusations regarding reprisals and other outrages charged to the crown forces.
