

# ANTI-BOLSHEVIKI ASK AID FOR RUSSIA

### Allied Governments to Be Asked to Recognize Assembly Created in Paris

## DISMEMBERMENT OPPOSED

Paris, Feb. 1.—Formal proposals are about to be made to the governments of Great Britain, France and the United States to recognize the Russian constituent assembly as the present de jure, or rightful existing government of Russia. The Russian constituent assembly has just been created at a meeting here of all the Russian elements opposed to Bolshevism for the purpose of seeking all differences of opinion and presenting a united front against the Soviet Government.

President Avramoff, a member of the former Kerensky cabinet of Russia, and presiding officer of the conference held here, will call in a few days on M. Brandl, president of the council of France, and present the motion for recognition of the constituent assembly as the Russian governmental representative. A. I. Kerensky, head of the former Russian Government, who recently attended the constituent assembly here, has gone to London, where he will make a similar appeal to the British Government.

Boris A. Baklanoff, Russian ambassador at Washington, who recently arrived here to take part in the formation of the new constituent assembly, is understood to have been requested to present a similar motion to the United States Government.



WHEN these conditions were fully understood by the manufacturer, there was a big change. The employer put it up to his foremen. They formed a club, later a course of study.

Three times a week they met with the employer to discuss subjects of common interest.

They studied the Constitution of the United States, which not one of them had read before their initial meeting—they discussed religion—nationalities, politics.

They grappled with the alien problem and laid plans for the Americanization of every alien in the plant.

The Result? A short time ago, in a general wage strike, allowing a certain type of workers, not one man walked out of this particular shop.

They were satisfied to leave it to their "Bosses."
