ROBBERIES PROVE STUDENTS' PRANK

State College Men Were 'Collecting Souvenirs,' West Chester Police Say

FREED, COME TO RELAYS

Two State College students, hiking to this city to root for their team at the Penn relays, spent last night in West Chester jail when the police couched their souvenir-collecting prank with a real robbery committed at the same time.

The young men are William Smith, seventeen years old, DuBois, Pa., and Jack Fisher, eighteen years, Johnstown, Pa. They left State College, near Bellefonte, Pa., Thursday, bound for Franklin Field.

When they reached West Chester yesterday afternoon they remembered they both knew a friend at the West Chester State Normal School. They visited the girls and as they left the school asked for some souvenirs by which to remember their long hike.

The girls gave each boy a silver spoon, and as they passed through the hallway of the building they spotted the sign bearing a quotation of Bayard Taylor, Chester county poet and novelist. This they pocketed with the spoons. As they proceeded down High street an "Enter without ringing" sign, hanging on the doorbell of a physician's home, caused a yearning to possess it.

At about this time the real robbery was committed. Five hundred dollars in Liberty bonds and cash was stolen from the Imperial Apartments, on East Gray street. It was reported to the police and then some one remembered seeing the two strangers in town, dressed in khaki breeches, leggings and old sweaters.

Chief of Police Ettriken put two and two together when a few moments later, the physician reported the loss of his sign. The Oakland police were telephoned and the boys were arrested in Chief Ettriken's headquarters, on a trolley car at Lansdown.

It was definitely proved today the boys had committed no greater sin than robbing a sign, and they had had no connection with the robbery of the apartment house. They were released after they had returned their souvenirs and had given up an automatic pistol which Fisher had taken along for protection.

VETERANS TO PARADE

10,000 Expected in Line of March at Loyalty Demonstration

Members of Veterans of Foreign Wars posts will parade on Broad street tomorrow as a loyalty demonstration. It is expected 10,000 men will be in line. The route of the procession will be from Broad and Diamond streets to Spring Garden street, to the Parkway, to City Hall, to Broad and Moore streets.

Major General C. P. Summerall, commanding the First Division, Camp Dix, will lead the parade, with his staff, the line to be reviewed at the Union League by Governor Sproul, Mayor Moore, Receiver of Taxes Kendrick and other city and state officials.

Following the parade will be a banquet at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel at 6 o'clock. A ball and reception at Mercantile Hall, Friday night, will close the week of festivities in connection with the event.
