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NAB YOUTH POSING AS WANAMAKER KIN

Alleged Impostor Had Name Right, but Was Away Off on Address

HELD ON CHECK CHARGES

If some New Yorkers were better informed about the names of the streets in Philadelphia (particularly that there is no 110th street) it is probable that a certain gilded youth who had a good time for a day or two would have had a shorter "White Light" career.

Despite the discrepancies in his story the youthful adventurer had a hectic two days during which he passed worthless checks, amounting to more than \$500, as he represented himself to be the nephew of Rodman Wanamaker, and therefore the grandnephew of John Wanamaker, of this city.

Even after he had been taken into custody and the police had been informed that he was an impostor, the young man stuck to his story. He insisted that he was Harold D. Wanamaker, son of French U. Wanamaker, of 216 North 130th street, Philadelphia.

He gave his profession as a "writer" and proved it by writing at least three worthless checks, it is alleged.

The young man was arrested at Broadway and Forty-seventh street, New York, late last night on a complaint by the Scully-Walton Ambulance Service. It is alleged that he procured a limousine late Saturday afternoon and used it until the bill was up to \$60. He then presented a check to the taxi company for \$75, specifying that \$15 should be given the driver as a tip. Sunday afternoon he used the same car again and the check presented was the same size, but included only \$10 for the chauffeur.

Both these deals were put through due to the fact that he represented himself to be the nephew of Mr. Wanamaker.

The prisoner's right name is still unknown to the police. He is nattily dressed in an expensive green suit and wears a Croix de Guerre ribbon in his buttonhole. He says that he served two years in France and points to a scar back of his left ear which he claims is a shrapnel wound.

According to the police, besides the check for the taxi company the young man disposed of one for \$400 on a member of the New York Athletic Club.

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PATROLMAN FELS SUSPECT IN FIGHT

Corners Man After Chase in West Philadelphia and Uses Club in Battle

FOUR SHOTS ARE FIRED

Cornered after a chase in which four shots were fired by a patrolman early today, a suspected thief battled with the bluecoat at Sixtieth street and Larchwood avenue until knocked senseless with a club. He had been detected trying to steal a motorcar, police say.

Patrolman Kiesel, of the Fifty-fifth and Pine streets station, saw two men at 4 o'clock this morning in the neighborhood of Sixtieth street and Cedar avenue. By keeping in the shadows,

At the first whir of the engine, Kiesel ran forward. The lookout yelled to his companion, who jumped from the machine and ran. The chase led up Fifty-ninth street to Pine, to Sixtieth street, then to Larchwood avenue, the patrolman gaining steadily. The suspect did not slacken speed when Kiesel fired four shots in the air.

The man who had been in the motorcar was overtaken at Larchwood avenue. He turned suddenly and led a straight fight for the patrolman's jaw. The blow failed to land, and Kiesel brought his club down on the man's head.

After his scalp wound was patched up at a hospital the prisoner was taken to the station house. He said he was Joseph Shearer, twenty-six years old, no home. The second man escaped.
