

Cake Has Real Nutritive Value
Necessary to the Diet, Says Mrs. Wilson

Plain, Simple Kinds Are Delicious With Fruit in This Hot Weather—Three Stock Recipes and Methods to Vary Them

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PLAIN, simple cakes are part of the summer menu and this is particularly true where there is an abundance of fruit and vegetables on the table. Cake has a real food value and is largely an energy food. From a dietetic standpoint, I really believe, during summer and fall the fruit and vegetable season and that these foods have little heat and energy value; for this reason, cake may be added to the menu. Then, too, many folk occasionally enjoy a piece of cake with a dish of fruit and then select a few cake pans to suit the size of their family. Two small, rather deep layer cake pans, for making white mountain cake; a deep layer cake pan of large size for crumb cake; one or two deep layer cake pans for making chocolate cake and a round pan with a center for loaf cakes, together with two or three fancy cookie cutters, will make a nice collection and will only cost \$1.00.

Try to make a cake in a pan that is not suited to the purpose often causes failure. Elaborate cakes and their decorations have no place in this hot weather. Plan three stock recipes and methods to vary them. Try this style of old-fashioned fruit shortcake:

Cherry Shortcake
One-half cup of sugar,
Four tablespoons of shortening,
One egg,
Two cups of flour,
Four level teaspoons of baking powder.

Three-quarters cup of milk,
One-half teaspoon of nutmeg,
One-half teaspoon of salt.

Beat to mix thoroughly and then turn in a large, deep layer cake pan that has been nicely greased and floured; before turning in the mixture spread evenly and then cover the top with three cups of stoned cherries, pressing them firmly into the dough. Dot with one tablespoon of butter and sprinkle liberally with brown sugar. Bake in a slow oven for thirty-five minutes. When cold, serve in wedge or pie-shaped cuts with plain or with custard sauce.

Plumlets
Plumlets are little old-fashioned rice flour sponge cake; they are delicious, particularly with ice cream or lemonade. Place in a mixing bowl
Two-thirds cup of sugar,
Two eggs,
Five tablespoons of water,
Four tablespoons of flour,
Two-thirds cup of rice flour,
Two level teaspoons of baking powder.

One-quarter teaspoon of nutmeg.
Beat this mixture until smooth and then add the stiffly beaten whites of eggs by cutting and folding in. Now mix with a little melted butter and add mixed two dozen individual crumpet pans and fill each one just a little better than one-half full. Set the pans in a moderate oven and bake for twelve minutes. Muffin pans may be used in place of the crumpet pans.

When cold the plumlets are fed with a water icing, but they are fine if just dusted with confectioner's sugar.

White Mountain Cake
Place in a bowl
Four tablespoons of rice flour,
Three-quarters cup of flour,
Four tablespoons of cornstarch,
One-quarter teaspoon of salt,
Two teaspoons of baking powder.
Sift twice to blend and then place in a mixing bowl
One cup of sugar,
Yolks of three eggs,
Cream well and then add
One teaspoon of vanilla,
One-quarter teaspoon of grated rind of lemon,
Tiny pinch of nutmeg,
Six tablespoons of water,
The prepared flour.

Beat hard to form a smooth batter and then cut and fold into this mixture the stiffly beaten whites of two eggs. Turn into two small deep layer-cake pans which have been well greased with lard and then floured; bake in moderate oven for eighteen minutes.

When cold put together with the following mixture: Place the remaining whites of egg in small bowl and add one-third glass of apple or quince jelly. Beat until mixture holds its shape and then add three tablespoons of marshmallow whip and one teaspoon of plain which has been soaked in one tablespoon of water in a cup for ten minutes. Then place the cup containing the gelatin in a pan of warm water to melt the gelatin. Cool before adding to the filling mixture and then beat the whip and jelly meringue and marshmallow whip and prepared gelatin until quite stiff and then use.

Peach Fudding Cake
Grease and flour a deep layer cake pan well and then place in a mixing bowl
Three-quarters cup of sugar,
Five tablespoons of shortening,
One egg,
Two cups of flour,
One-half teaspoon of salt,
Four level teaspoons of baking powder.

Seven-eighths cup of water.
Beat hard to mix to a smooth batter and then pour one-half of this batter spread smoothly. Now cover thickly with thinly sliced peaches, arranging cover as smoothly as possible. Then pour the rest of the batter and spread smoothly. Cover with a thin slice of peaches and brown sugar and bake in a moderate oven for forty minutes.

Inexpensive Coconut Cake
Coconut layer cake is an ideal summer cake and need not be overly rich. Place in a bowl
One cup of sugar,
Six tablespoons of melted shortening,
Two eggs,
Beat to a cream and then add
Two and three-quarters cups of flour,
Four level teaspoons of baking powder,
One and one-quarter cups of water.

Beat to a smooth batter and then turn batter into two well-greased and floured deep layer cake pans and bake in a hot oven for twenty minutes. Put together with any tart jelly and cover the cake with plain water icing and then with coconut.

Coconut Jelly Roll
This cake is new and easy to make. Use the plunket recipe and use one cup of flour in place of the rice flour mixture. Then line a shallow baking sheet with paper and grease well and then spread the mixture evenly, having the

batter about one-half inch thick. Bake in a hot oven for twelve minutes and then turn on a towel and spread liberally with tart jelly, then with coconut which has been put through food chopper and add one-half cup of finely chopped nuts. Roll as for jelly roll and then dust thickly with confectioner's sugar.

MRS. WILSON'S ANSWERS
My Dear Mrs. Wilson—Two days ago you published a recipe for pound cake. I want to ask if this cake could be made with raisins, and, if so, will you kindly tell me how many should be used?

Yes, use one-half package of seeded raisins, placed on cake when in pan and pressed in slightly into batter.

Dear Mrs. Wilson—Can you tell me what causes candy, or chocolate, to get a thin white mold on it? And in this mold injurious if the candy is eaten?

Too much heat causes this trouble. It is not injurious and may be eaten. Melt the chocolate over hot water and just as soon as it starts melting, remove from the stove.
