NEW PARTY MEETS TONIGHT

United Body to Organize in Each Ward

A meeting will be held tonight at the headquarters of the Central Labor Union, 232 North Ninth street, to organize the United Party in every ward and obtain a fund for the campaign in the municipal election.

The delegates who attended the convention of the Allied Workers' Political Council, which formed the new United Party, Saturday, submitted their reports of the proceedings. After considerable discussion, which threatened to develop serious differences, the reports were approved by the meeting.

John A. Lezer, one of the delegates to the convention, declared he was at variance with all of the actions of the convention and added: "The purpose of the men who started the new party was not to help the laboring people, but to deliver the labor movement into the hands of other organizations. The party will be a failure on election day."
