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LEGIONARIES WILL POLICE CONVENTION

Greatest Military Leaders of Modern Times En Route to Kansas City

PLAN PARADE 7 MILES LONG

By the Associated Press. Kansas City, Mo., Oct. 29.—An army of former service men began to descend upon Kansas City today for the annual convention of the American Legion, which opens next Monday.

A force of legionaries as large as the city's police force will be on special duty, as military police, during the convention, and their activities will be confined to the legionaries. Today's work dealt mainly with arrangements for the parade Tuesday, which will be more than seven miles long and include 40,000 or more marchers.

Foremost military leaders of modern times are among those en route here to be guests of the Legion, including Marshal Foch, of France, commander-in-chief of the allied armies; Lieutenant General Baron Jacques, of Belgium; General Armando Diaz, of Italy; and Admiral Earl Beatty, of Great Britain.

Marshal Foch is expected Monday, accompanied by General Pershing.
