## RE-ELECTED AT LAST

**T**HE City Council has at last come to its senses, and to the law by re-electing Ed. T. Stotsbury as a member of the Slating Fund Commission.

The commission is composed of Mr. McLean and the Controller, ex-officio, and three members chosen by the City Council. It was the intention of the members that Mr. Stotsbury should be chosen chairman. Mr. Stotsbury was elected originally, however, by the City Council, and he served the entire year without the election of a chairman of his own. The other members of the council are the other three members, although he offices among two others, have declined a Committee chair.

This is an honest, bad policy. It has defrauded Mr. Stotsbury of his position, because as it appears to the public, it would have been much wiser to elect him from the beginning. Then if for any reason a loss does occur, he could easily make good, and the public would know exactly what he did.

Mr. Stotsbury made the statement, as follows:

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
