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RECORDS ARE GONE, HIDING STOCK DEALS

Taken Before Officers of Defunct Firm Vanished, Says Receiver

LIABILITIES NEAR \$500,000

All loose-leaf ledger pages referring to the accounts of officers of the bankrupt Simon-Scheffer Company, Inc., 1309 Arch street, have disappeared, Francis J. Walsh, the receiver, announced today. He said the losses will total \$500,000.

Harry A. Simon, Maurice R. Scheffer and John J. Stein, promoters of the company, still are missing. Warrants charging embezzlement and fraudulent conversion have been issued for them.

After working most of the night on the books of the stock brokerage concern, Mr. Walsh and his attorneys discovered that South Jersey residents have been hit hard by the failure.

Liabilities Around \$500,000

Based on the extent of the campaign carried on in South Jersey and in several counties of Pennsylvania, I believe the company's liabilities will reach \$500,000, Mr. Walsh said today.

Mr. Walsh said there is evidence that the persuasive stock peddlers even went to farmhouses in isolated districts, selling "arguments" and high-sounding references to good "stocks" that had piled up fortunes for the fortunate.
