CAST on 104 stitches. K 6 ribs even. 13th row: K 6, over 2 tog, repeat from \* to last 6 stitches and k these.

14th row: K 6, p to last 6 sts, k these. 15th row: K plain. 16th and 17th rows: Repeat 14th and 15th rows.


