

STILL ABSENT, MAY DODGE TRIAL

Chief Crows That He Will Choose Flight Rather Than Face Charges

PULLER PROBE PUSHED

Timothy D. Dier, bankrupt stock broker, has not yet delivered himself up, although he has been expected back in New York several days. The belief is growing that he may decide to remain a fugitive from justice. His attorney, Nash Rockwood, has telephoned from Portland, Me., to ask whether his client had returned. He seemed surprised when told Dier had not yet come back to face the music.

Dier, head of the defunct firm of E. D. Dier & Co., together with his partner, Harry J. Lawrence, and two of the managers, Benjamin F. Shrimpton and Adam Recklin, was indicted for larceny and bucking of orders a week ago. There are sixteen counts against Dier and Lawrence and nine against the two managers. The managers are charged with bucking orders. Lawrence surrendered himself on Wednesday and was released on \$15,000 bail. A week's search has failed to locate the others.
