FORTY POLICEMEN HUNT FOR THIEVES

Watchman Surprises Gang Attempting to Rob Thirteenth Street Store

TWO SHOTS ARE FIRED

Forty policemen from three districts searched six buildings from roof to cellar in an effort to arrest a gang of four thieves who fired at a watchman when he surprised them in the act of robbing the store of Charles C. N. Kelly, Jr., furrier, at 40 North Thirteenth street yesterday.

Hundreds of persons, returning home late, filled the streets to watch the policemen as they forced an entrance into each building. The search proved futile, no trace of the robbers having been found after a hunt of nearly two hours.

Police searched buildings on Cuthbert, Thirteenth and Arch streets. As the hunt ended three men jumped into a red touring car which had been parked in Cuthbert street near Twelfth. It is believed these may have been the robbers, who returned to the scene to recover their machine, unaware that two score policemen were searching for them.

Frank Stener, 208 Bridge street, Frankford, employed as a relief watchman in the building occupied by the publishing firm of A. K. Helman Company, at 1220 Arch street, was responsible for frustrating the robbery. As he made his rounds he heard a noise in the alley which runs through from Arch to Cuthbert street, at the side of the building.

He threw open a shutter and directed the spot light on the red touring car. A man stood on the fire escape in the rear of No. 40.

In another moment two shots rang out, one of the bullets whizzing by Stener's head. As he raised his own revolver the man darted down the fire escape to the street.

Suddenly three men were seen running over the roofs. Stener sent for the police and within a few minutes details arrived from the Eleventh and Water, Twelfth and Berkswood, and Thirteenth and Vine streets stations.

A skylight on the top floor was open and under it stood a chair from which the robbers had apparently climbed out on the roof to jump over an entrance into the Malch building adjoining.

PISTOL FIGHT WITH POLICE FOLLOWS DUEL OVER GIRL

Motorists and Pedestrians Flee to Cover as Shots Fly in Broad Street

Score of shots were exchanged by two policemen and a Negro in front of the Olympia A. A. Broad street below Baltimore, yesterday afternoon.

While the battle lasted motorists on Broad street stopped their machines and ran for cover and pedestrians sought haven in alleys to get out of range.

WILLIAM F. PARIS HONORED BY FRANCE AND BELGIUM

Philadelphian Decorated for Relief Work During War

William Franklin Paris, of 2301 De Lancey street, writer and architectural decorator, has received word that he has been made a Chevalier of the Legion of Honor of France and a Knight of the Order of the Crown of Belgium.

In wartime Mr. Paris was active in raising funds for the relief of families of French and Belgian artists. His wife, whom he married in 1914, was Margaret Wynne Levering Jones. She is a daughter of the late J. Levering Jones, of 2301 De Lancey street.

Mr. Paris was born in New York and made his home there before coming to this city. He was United States Commissioner of Decorative Art by appointment of President McKinley at the Paris Exposition in 1900, and directed the decoration of the United States National Pavilion there.

He was a captain in the 108th Regiment, New York Volunteers, in the Spanish-American War, and was a captain in the World War.

Nevertheless, but few of the city's dwellers really know, for instance, the enchantment of the Wissahickon Glen or the surpassing beauty and wonders of Fairmount Park.

As part of the "Know Your City" campaign, and for the guidance of those who may seek the physical relaxation—and mental and spiritual stimulus—to be gained by a hike in the open, the following series of Trolley Hikes has been carefully prepared to offer a wide variety of enjoyable walks, ranging from two to six miles, all of which will be found equally inviting at almost any season of the year.

- Trolley Hike No. 1 4 Miles
THROUGH THE WISSAHICKON
Route 22—Germantown Ave. Change at Bethlehem Pike to City Line. Walk west-left to Wissahickon; down stream to Valley Green—3 miles; to Lehigh Drive—1 mile; left to Rittenhouse Street—Route 27—Chelten Ave.
- Trolley Hike No. 2 3 Miles
THE UPPER WISSAHICKON
Route 22—Germantown Ave. Change at Bethlehem Pike to City Line. Walk west-left to Wissahickon; down stream to Rox Ave—2 miles; follow Rox Ave—left—up Hill to Route 22 at Bethlehem Pike—1 mile.
- Trolley Hike No. 3 4 Miles
WISSAHICKON—GRESHEIM CREEK
Route 22—Wayne Ave. to Carpenter Lane; left to Hickory Mill road; to Wissahickon; walk up stream to Valley Green; cross to east bank, right to Gresham Creek; left to Route 22 German town Ave.
- Trolley Hike No. 4 2 to 3 Miles
THE LOWER WISSAHICKON
Route 22—Wayne Ave. to Carpenter Lane; left on Carpenter Lane to Kitchener's; left to Wissahickon; down stream to Johnson Drive; left, along Drive to Ridge Ave; Route 41, or short cut left, along Drive to Rittenhouse Street—Route 27—Chelten Ave.
- Trolley Hike No. 5 2 1/2 Miles
SHEET SHAR YALE—FAIRMOUNT PARK
Route 15—Grisco Ave. to 5th St. Entrance Follow path-right-up arch (for Lake River Drive, turning left at Pumping Station, on dirt road, left) to Horticultural Mall. Follow Lake Ponds to Parkside—Route 16, 22, 40, 43.
- Trolley Hike No. 6 3 1/2 Miles
GEORGES HILL—FAIRMOUNT PARK
Route 22 to 53d St. Entrance. Turn steps to Georges Hill. Follow Drive—left to stanchion. Right on path, cross drive, down slope. Left to West Mountain. Left on curving drive, east side, to Georges Hill; sign "Wynansfield Drive" right, to 51st St.—Route 41 or 43.
- Trolley Hike No. 7 3 1/2 Miles
CHAMOUNIX—FAIRMOUNT PARK
Route 41 or 43 to 72d St. & Midvale. Cross Falls Bridge. Right, under B. R. bridge, left, up Hill, to Wissahickon; walk up stream to Valley Green; left, to Wissahickon; left, to Falls Bridge—Route 41 or 43.
- Trolley Hike No. 8 3 to 4 Miles
STREVERY—LEAS HILL—FAIRMOUNT PARK
Route 7, 8, 16, 19 or 81 to 82d & Fairmount Entrance. Left, across to Wissahickon; left, to Wissahickon; right, down hill to River Drive; left, to tunnel; left, up curving drive, to Wissahickon; left, to Wissahickon; straight through Lemon Hill to Green at—Route 12, 44 and 48.

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
