

**METHODIST WOMEN MEET IN READING**

400 Delegates Attend Opening Sessions of Foreign Missionary Society  
84 ALIENS GET CITIZENSHIP

Reading, Pa., Oct. 4.—The Philadelphia branch of the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church began its fifty-second annual meeting here last night. Miss Carrie J. Carnahan, of Pittsburgh, branch corresponding secretary, was the speaker. The Rev. Dr. James E. Crowther, of Seattle, will address the Wednesday evening meeting on "The Horsemen of the Apocalypse." Bishop Francis J. McManis, of Pittsburgh, will speak at the public service Thursday evening on "The New China." Mrs. Robert Inghill, of Harrisburg, is presiding and Mrs. W. T. Cooper, of Lansdowne, is secretary. The department conferences took place in the afternoon, being conducted by the following:  
Auxiliary Presidents, Mrs. Francis J. McConnell, Pittsburgh; Conference Secretaries, Miss Carrie J. Carnahan, Pittsburgh; Department Secretaries, Miss Susan C. Lodge, Philadelphia; Treasurers, Mrs. Curtis Snow, Willow Grove; Missionaries, Miss Janet H. Cox, Pittsburgh; District Presidents, Miss Helen R. The territory of the organization covers all of Pennsylvania and Delaware, and 400 delegates are here for four days. There are 700 auxiliaries within the jurisdiction of the society.  
The Philadelphia branch represents a membership of 60,000 and spends \$2,000,000 a year on its work. Last night the annual budget was prepared amounting to \$250,000 for the coming year's work.  
Berks County Commissioners today issued a voucher for \$12,000 to meet part of the consideration by which it takes over the Navesink Mountain Tuberculosis Sanatorium and turns it into a county hospital. The transfer was authorized by the voters here last year, and the State has finally approved it.  
Berks County Court today granted citizenship to fifty-four aliens, including five women, here today. Four of the women were nurses. Twelve more were turned down and the rest of a list of more than seventy were postponed.  
City water officials today, to reassure folks anxious about the supply, announced that all reservoirs are full of water and that there is no danger of a shortage. The supply source can withstand a much longer drought, it was stated. All water used here is filtered.




