

WILL APPEAL VERDICT

Walter K. Mellon, of Bryn Mawr, member of a wealthy Main Line family, was found guilty by a jury at Norristown today of shooting and robbing Frank Yennesse, of Philadelphia, a taxi cab driver.

The verdict was returned sealed at 7:15 o'clock last night, after court had adjourned, and was not opened until Judge Miller convened court at 10 o'clock this morning.

Sentence was deferred pending an appeal for a new trial which the young man's counsel announced he would make.

Mellon, son of the late Frank P. Mellon, a lumber merchant of Philadelphia, inherited an estate of \$20,000 and some real estate when he became of age last month.
