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YOUTHFUL TRIO ARRESTED WITH BURGLARY LOOT

Police Believe They Have Men Responsible for Series of Robberies of Homes.

Men responsible for the half score of burglaries reported in Great Falls recently are believed by Chief of Police Marcus Anderson to have been apprehended Wednesday with the arrest of Anthony Kline, 18; George Dudeck, 22, and John Crane, 22, all late of Anacosta. The suspects were arrested in a shack at the rear of 519 Eighth avenue south, and a large amount of stolen property was found in and under the building.

Kline, Dudeck and Crane came under suspicion with the police principally because they were bachelors and in position to use to advantage the provisions stolen from nearly all of the places burglarized. In addition, they were known to roam about the city at night, and sleep by day.

Chief Anderson and Officers Herman Rydell and J. L. Baltazor went to the shack Wednesday morning without a definite clue that its occupants were burglars, but were convinced at once of the accuracy of the lead when a copper-colored alarm clock, stolen from the residence of Rev. D. L. McGiff, was seen on a table.

Men Found in Bed.

All of the men were in bed, and Dudeck, who came to the door, refused to permit a search of the shack without a search warrant. By the time the refusal was uttered, the chief had glimpsed the alarm clock and the three were taken to the police station. Returning, the officers found property from all but two of the places from which losses had been reported. The greater portion of the loot had been hidden under the shack.

Presence of the shack of Angeline Ward, 16 year old daughter of Mrs. Mike Ward of the west side, when the officers returned the second time gave rise to the belief that she knew something of the activities of the suspect and she was taken to the police station and questioned. It was learned that

TERM OF "SCAB" NOT SUFFICIENT TO PREVENT FINE

"Unfair" Banner Carrier Has Power Company Firemen Arrested for Assault.

Alleged use of the term "scab" at a meeting of the Cascade County Trades and Labor assembly last Monday night precipitated an assault Wednesday afternoon on William George, carrier of an "unfair" banner at the National laundry, Tenth street and First avenue north, that resulted in the fining in police court of H. Edmondson and Jack Kaufman, fireman at the Montana Power Co.'s Tenth street sub-station.

Edmondson and Kaufman admitted the assault, but pleaded not guilty. They attempted to justify their attack on George by declaring that he had called them "scabs" and "stool pigeons" on the floor of the assembly.

Testifying, George said that he was peacefully carrying the banner when Edmondson came up and demanded an apology, to which he replied that if he used the terms at all it was when he was angry and not accountable for what he said. Edmondson replied, according to the witness, that the explanation was not satisfactory, and struck George in the face, knocking him down. Kaufman then took a hand, the evidence showed, and with Edmondson forcibly took George across the street to the substation, where the alleged threats were made.

Both defendants admitted the accuracy of George's testimony, but thought that their reason for attacking him was sufficient to defeat the charge of assault. Their testimony was cut short by Magistrate George Raban and they were each fined \$10.

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Philipsburg Protests Taking Off Sunday Train to Drummond

Helena, Jan. 26.—Business men of Philipsburg have protested to the Montana railroad commission against discontinuance of the Sunday train between that city and Drummond. Residents of Lodgegrass have also appealed to the commission against service of the Burlington at that place. The patrons claim that the station agent is on duty from 8 a. m. to 5 p. m. daily, but that only one train passes through the town during those hours, and the heavier travel is on three other trains which arrive and depart when no agent is on the job.

Both complaints have been forwarded to the respective railroads with requests by the state commission that they answer within 10 days.

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
