HIGHLANDERS SWAP SEVEN PLAYERS FOR JOHNNY MITCHELL

Coast League Shortstop Brings High Price in Baseball Trade Just Announced.

Los Angeles, Jan. 29.—Johnny Mitchell, shortstop for the Vernon club of the Pacific coast Baseball league, has been traded to the New York Americans for seven players, it was announced here Friday.

The transaction involves the San Francisco club of the Coast league and the Toledo club of the American association. The Yankees, it is announced, have arranged to purchase Mitchell in exchange for Mitch Ham Hyatt, first baseman, "owned" party by New York and Toledo; Roy Corhan, shortstop and "Slim" Love, pitcher, San Francisco; "Truck" Hannah, catcher, Erie Shore and R. C. McGraw, pitchers, New York, and a seventh player to be named.

San Francisco, Jan. 28.—Roy Corhan, field captain and shortstop of the San Francisco club in the Pacific Coast league, has been traded to the Vernon club along with "Slim" Love, pitcher, in exchange for Frank O'Doul, pitcher and an outfielder who will be named later, officials of the local club have announced.

The trade was arranged by the New York Americans who sent O'Doul and other players to Vernon in exchange for Johnny Mitchell, shortstop.
