WARRANT FOR SON, FATHER ARRESTED. Fine of \$10 in Police Court Appealed by Alleged Auto Speeder.

Because he came into the police station Thursday morning with a .32 calibre revolver which he said he was carrying to protect himself and his belongings, he has been arrested by police officers who have been threatening his life, Constanine George, a Bulgarian, was arrested by Chief of Police Marcus Anderson and is being held in the city jail in connection with the investigation by the county authorities as to his singling.

George told Chief Anderson that a "black hand" organization which had been killing people and throwing them into the Missouri river had threatened his life because of his knowledge of the gang's doings. He said he had been threatened with death and several times attempts had been made on his life, with the result that he was carrying the revolver.
