JURY LONG OUT BRINGS VERDICT AGAINST SCOTT

Alleged Gangster Must Serve Prison Term for Robbery of Arvon Landlady.

After 23 hours of deliberation and after twice reporting that an agreement was impossible, a district court jury Wednesday afternoon brought in a verdict of guilty against Sam J. Scott, accused of robbing the Arvon rooming house on the morning of July 4, 1920. It was reported that on the first ballot the jury stood nine for conviction and two for acquittal. The verdict was reached after the jury had been in seclusion for 23 hours.

Wade testified that Morello then had a gun in his hand and that after he stepped back into the building Morello and Danno were both in the street throwing rocks, supposedly at Sanders. Wade was not certain where Morello had obtained the gun, but it was his opinion that he drew it from his coat pocket. The witness did not then know who had been shot, but was told a short time later by McShane that it was Sanders.

W. E. Spahn, former deputy sheriff, heard the statement made by the defendant after his arrest and testified he heard Morello say he fired the shot at Sanders. As recounted by Spahn, Morello's statement was that Sanders rattled the door and was told to go away by Danno, after which Danno and Sanders engaged in a fight when Sanders refused to leave at Danno's request. The witness quoted the defendant as saying that he shot at Sanders when the latter had Danno bent over the hitch rail. McShane and Samuelson testified that Sanders and Danno first came to the door he called Sanders a vile name.

Didn't Know He Was Shot.

Sanders did not know he was shot until after the wound caused by the rock had been noticed. Sanders was shooting he walked down the street to a pool hall, where he was found by McShane and the others, sitting bent over in a chair. The wound made by the rock had been noticed at the side of his head, but he was complaining of pains in his stomach. At the doctor's office there was no thought of a gunshot wound until a hole was noticed in his shirt and upon tearing off his clothing the doctor found a small blood spot and a bullet hole on his back. The injured man was then brought to a Great Falls hospital by automobile.

The bullet entered Sanders back just below the left kidney and passed almost entirely through the body, puncturing the folds of intestines and penetrating the stomach and other abdominal organs, according to Dr. K. Woods, who attended the patient in Great Falls. The wound was extremely dangerous and similar injuries frequently terminate fatally. Dr. Wood stated. The bullet ranged inward and upward after entering the back, but it was impossible to determine whether Sanders was in a stooping position when he was shot. Dr. Woods said the wound would have been possible from a gunshot.

Testimony Not Shaken. All witnesses were exhaustively cross examined by H. R. Eickemeyer, of counsel for the defense, but their testimony was not shaken. Frank Polinski, associated with Mr. Eickemeyer in conducting the defense, stated to the jury in opening the defense that evidence would show that Sanders was in a stooping position when intoxicated and that on the night before the shooting he had insulted a woman and had been ejected from a dance hall while drunk. Morello, he stated, fired the shot into the sidewalk to frighten Sanders after he had seen Danno bent over the rail.

Woman's Testimony Ruled Out. Judge Lewis ruled out testimony proposed to be given by Nellie Klemis of Belt, who was called by the defense to tell of the dance hall incident. The court held that the fray between Sanders and Morello was not traceable to this disturbance and that it was not relevant to the charge against the defendant. The examination of witnesses for the defense will be continued this (Thursday) morning.

Sappington's suspension was recommended by Chief of Police Marcus Anderson, who charged that the officer engaged in a card game at the north side of the bridge.

OIL LAND TITLE IN ISSUE IN SUIT IN U. S. COURT

Two Interests Secured Leases on Old Fradd Homestead, in Winnett Field.

Title to several hundred of acres in the oil fields near Lewistown depends upon the outcome of the civil suit, which will be tried in federal court today (Thursday). The Schaeffer Oil & Refining company, plaintiffs in the case, are bringing suit against Nels D. Fradd, C. P. Ritter, W. L. Lawson et al. to quiet title to 320 acres of land that lies in the center of the oil activities near Winnett.

The land involved is the old Fradd homestead and is in sections 4 and 9 in township 15, N., Range 29, E. It was leased to Schaeffer Oil & Refining Co. It is alleged that the first lease was given two days prior to making of final proof on the homestead entry.

On September 2, 1920, Nels D. Fradd leased the same property to C. P. Ritter and an associate. The latter began drilling immediately and during January 1921 the Ritter-Lawson well was brought in. Now suit to quiet title to the land is being brought by the Schaeffer Oil & Refining Co., the first lessee on the ground that the first lease was void and because of the want of mutuality and that it was unilateral and void, and also for want of consideration.

CHANGING HISTORY NEEDS NEW BOOKS

Texts for Grade Schools of Montana Are Changed by State Commission.

New text books in history and civics will be in use in the grade schools of Great Falls and throughout Montana next autumn. The state textbook commission made the decision at its recent regular biennial meeting in Helena. There had been no change in these texts for many years. Due to the rapidly which history has been made in the last few years, and the change that has taken place in the type of citizenship which all ages must be taught, it was deemed necessary to make the change. The new contracts have been made for six years. New price lists will be distributed through the county superintendents as soon as all details can be attended to by the secretary of the commission and the lists printed.

The new basal adoption for history are, for seventh and eighth grades, "The Making of Our Country," Smith Burnham; for sixth grade, "Introductory American History," Bourne and Benton; for fourth and fifth grades, "Stories of American History," Gordy (combined stories) early and later American history) or in two volumes, "Stories of Early American History" and "Stories of Later American History." The new civics book to be adopted will be "Community Civics" by Hughes. The contract for the physiology texts has also expired, but largely because of the expense which a change in a large number of books at the present time would mean to many districts already short of funds, the commission decided to renew its contracts for the physiology texts, "Physiology and Hygiene," by Conn. and the "Principles of Public Health," by Tuttle.

Equity Association Is Sued for \$995

JUDGE IS LENIENT WITH BLACKWOOD

District Court Sentence Light Because Defendant Convicted in U. S. Court.

Taking into consideration the fact that the sentence recently imposed upon Robert Blackwood in federal court for bootlegging was for one of the offenses alleged by County Attorney H. G. Bennet in a state charge Judge H. H. Ewing Wednesday in district court sentenced Blackwood to serve 30 days in the county jail and ordered him to pay a fine of \$100. Blackwood pleaded guilty in both the federal and district courts and recently completed a 30 day jail sentence, imposed by Judge George Bourquin.

The federal charge to which Blackwood pleaded guilty covered liquor sales made September 15, 1920, and the same date was included in the state charge, which also alleged that sales were made by the defendant on August 9. Blackwood was represented by J. N. Theisen.
