ICE MEN AWAIT MARCH FREEZE FOR 1920 CROP

Warm Winter Has Prevented Harvesting Usual Supply for Great Falls.

Great Falls ice concerns are looking forward to March as a month during which enough ice can be obtained from the Missouri river to supply the summer's trade, according to L. W. Suhr of the Great Falls Ice Co.

Once during the present winter ice formed to a thickness of eight inches, but dealers waited for it to reach the usual depth of 12 or 15 inches before gathering the crop and the consequence was that the only opportunity to get ice of any quality passed without a pound being stored.
