New York, March 12.—The very thing which made baseball fans throughout the country look forward with deep interest to the projected two game series between the New York Giants and the Detroit Tigers at San Antonio, namely a supposed lack of cordiality between Ty Cobb manager of the Detroit, and Hughie Jennings former manager of that outfit, has arisen to prevent the series.

According to arrangements which, by the way, were never definite, the first game was to have been played today and the second tomorrow. Every one was all set up about the two contests and it looked as though nothing would occur to prevent them. Those, however, who know Ty Cobb and had marked his silence about the proposed battles, were not at all surprised when at the game in Georgia each announced that he had been hired to manage a ball club and not to run exhibition games.

The real reason is said to be by Jennings that Cobb showed to great desire to play baseball under his leadership and now evidently he does not wish to play a game with a club which Jennings leads.

Jennings Was Ready.  
As for Jennings, he himself has no great reason for loving Cobb and there are other Detroit veterans to whom Hugh owes nothing at all. There is no use going into this matter now; suffice it to say there is a general belief among baseball experts it was not Jennings' fault that the Tigers in recent years have not won pennants or at least finished higher up on the ladder. Jennings has not forgotten this—and there are other things he has not forgotten. But just the same this did not make him the least anxious to go into action as manager against his old team. In fact he looked forward to the encounter.

# MOVE TO POSTPONE TRIAL OF INDICTED SOX STARTS FIGHT

## Defense Wants Immediate Action; Prosecution Demands Time to Secure Evidence.

Chicago, March 12.—The state's attorney's office Saturday formally announced that when the trial of the Chicago White Sox players charged with throwing the 1919 world's series comes up next Monday, the state will move that the case be taken from the calendar and not brought back until next fall when the baseball season has ended. Attorneys for the defense said that they would insist on either an immediate trial or dismissal.

Judge K. M. Landis, baseball commissioner was informed of the state's announcement, said he would immediately place all of the indicted players on the ineligible list and that none of them would play in organized baseball pending the trial.

Secure New Evidence.  
The action of the state will be based on the ground that Judge George F. Barrett, retained by the American league to assist in the prosecution, only recently became connected with the case and has not had time to familiarize himself with it.

Mr. Barrett said that the reluctance which was being shown by some witnesses who testified before the grand jury to stand back of their testimony had made it necessary for the state to gather additional evidence.

A poorly handled trial would ruin baseball," he said, "while a case properly handled to the jury would save the game from disgrace."

Several Under Cover.  
Judge Barrett said new evidence was needed, "if the men back of the world series scandal and the men who took part in it were to be driven out of baseball and into the penitentiary."

"We have found that there were several persons who were not indicted who, perhaps, should have been," he continued. "We are seeking evidence against these men and when we get it we will present it to the state's attorney with a suggestion that it be taken before a grand jury."

"When State's Attorney Crowe came into office nothing had been done to prepare the case for the state."


