TO DIG THREE WELLS DURING THE SUMMER IN BENTON SECTION


Trio of Structures Near Fort Benton to Be Prospected—Rowe Bench to Be Drilled.

EYES ARE FOCUSED ON DEVELOPMENTS AT VAN DUZEN WELL

Drill in Discovery Well Is Nearing the Second Sand—Many Drilling Contracts Let.

Roundup, April 9.—That important developments may be expected from the Van Duzen well is shown by the fact that the entire official force of the company is at the well watching the drilling in of the second sand. With the arrival of the string of 2,200 feet of 3 1/2 inch casing, liner and string of tools, they were hurried out to the basin, and the casing lowered. It is thought that but a few feet remain between the bottom of the present hole and the second sand, and results of this operation are anxiously awaited here.



Will Drive Deeper Potter Basin Hole Sunk Two Years Ago

White Sulphur Springs, April 9.—Making use of an old hole which was driven a couple of years ago by the Liberty Oil & Gas Co. in Potter Basin a deep drilling test of that structure is now being made through the efforts of Earl Angell of this place. The well was put down to 2,700 feet a couple of years ago but operations stopped before the required depth was reached.

To Resume Drilling on Black Butte Dome; Bear Cat Is Sinking

Lewistown, April 9.—The stem for which the management of the Golden West at Black Butte has been waiting for some time, reached Roy Friday, to be taken out to the well Saturday if the roads were open. When it reaches the property and is adjusted drilling will at once be resumed.

The Bear Cat well at Black Butte is now going down rapidly. This well is in section 25-17-22 and is north of the Cosmo, presumably in a better location.

It is officially announced that the Big Lehman company has completed arrangements to have its acreage in the Devil's Basin drilled immediately. This land is a part of the old Rufus Thompson ranch and is considered equal to anything in that district.

O. G. Windsor and Roy E. Lewis were disappointed in not being able to move their rig out from Piper to the location 11 miles south of Lewistown Friday. The big storm has delayed them in this, but they will undertake the work immediately.
