## Country Club Opening Date Tentatively Set for Saturday, May 28

Although date for the formal opening of the Meadow Lark Country club cannot be definitely set until the workmen have made further progress on the interior of the building and furniture has been installed, society is looking forward to the initial social event at what will be the center of society activities in Great Falls.

Matrons and maids who have visited the club house have eyed with appreciative longing the long room, more than 100 feet from end to end, with its hardwood floor receiving the final polishing which will make it the best dancing floor in Great Falls.

The big golfers' lounge, with its windows looking out on three sides, giving a view of the lake, the river and northeast toward the city, will be furnished for the use of both men and women. The room, downstairs, immediately under the lounge, which will open into the men's dressing rooms and showers, probably will not be furnished until later in the summer.

The women's wing, on the upper floor, with its facilities for entertainment of small parties, and a dumb waiter to the corridor communicating with the kitchen, will be furnished as soon as possible, with easy chairs and tables for cards.
