AMERICANS TO BUILD Hangars for Chinese Air Mail Service
Shanghai, April 9.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press.)—The Peiking-Shanghai air mail service will be advanced. Contracts for the building of two aero hangars at the Shanghai terminus were let following the purchase of the land. Incidentally these contracts were let to an American company.

It was planned to start work on these hangars in April and they are to be completed within four months. Two similar hangars are being built at Peiking and negotiations are being made for hangars at Tsinanfu, Shantung, P'ucheng and Pukow are being carried forward.

At each of the four aerodromes two Bimac commercial airplanes will be stationed and the actual flying will be done by relay when the service opens. Ultimately it is the purpose of the Chinese government greatly to extend its air service and in time to establish passenger carrying services.
