Taxes Are Increased On Mexican Oil by Decree of Obregon

Mexico City, June 8.—(By The Associated Press.)—Petroleum companies operating in Mexico must pay an average increase of 25 per cent in export taxes on their products, beginning July 1, under the terms of a decree issued by President Obregon in reaction to taxation which the government more than 30,000,000 pesos a year and the money obtained will be used solely in making payments on Mexico's foreign debt, on which not even the interest has been paid since 1913 and which amounts to more than 600,000,000 pesos.

GERMANS HALT SILESIA MARCH

Allied Troops Instructed Not to Begin First Battling.
Paris, June 8.—General von Hoefler, head of the German defense forces in Upper Silesia, has formally assured the allied officials in that region that his troops, which advanced several kilometers in the Annaberg sector after the insurgent attacks of Friday and Saturday last, will advance no further; says a dispatch from Berlin Wednesday.

General von Hoefler's assurance came as a result of the allied ultimatum of Sunday last, which threatened that unless he withdrew his forces the French troops in the industrial section of Upper Silesia would be withdrawn.

Oppell, June 8.—(By The Associated Press.)—From sources considered reliable it is learned that General Leronet, head of the inter-allied commission, has issued verbal instructions to the British, Italian and French troops not to fire on Polish insurgents unless first attacked.
