COST OF LIVING FIGURES URGED BY UNION MEN

Issue Statement Asserting Common Labor Should Get \$5.25, Carpenters \$9.08.

Supporting the contention of the federal labor union and the building crafts that the new scales fixed by the city of Great Falls and the Associated Industries are not commensurate with the present cost of living, the Cascade County Trades & Labor assembly at a meeting in Carpenters' hall Monday afternoon issued a statement intended to show that to be consistent with living costs the scale should now be \$5.25 for common labor and \$9.08 for carpenters.
