JOHNSON RELEASED FROM JAIL, WANTS TO FIGHT DEMPSEY

Negro Pugilist Says He's Able to Whip Present Heavy-weight Champion.

Leavenworth, Kan., July 9.—Jack Johnson, former heavyweight pugilist champion, was released from Leavenworth federal prison Saturday after serving ten months of a year's sentence for violation of the Mann act.

Proud of War Record "I have a war record to be proud of," Johnson continued. "I offered myself to the government for military service during the war but I was not accepted."

He declared however that he did accept service for the American government in Spain during the war. His principal avocations, he said, were at Madrid and Barcelona. "My war record," the former champion said, "will stand investigation."

\$1400 SET ASIDE FOR COUNTY FAIR

Commissioners Instruct Cooney to Look Into Possibilities of Plan.

Opinion that Cascade county should initiate plans for the holding of a county fair next fall, was expressed Saturday by the board of county commissioners. E. H. Cooney, member of the county advisory board on the state fair exhibit, has been instructed to investigate the possibilities of arranging for such an institution.

The commissioners advance the argument that the present system of assembling and arranging Cascade county products for exhibition at the state fair, is a costly one and does not stimulate the interest of the producers.

The board appropriated \$1400 to be expended in providing a Cascade county exhibit for the state fair. C. M. Storm, who handled the field work and exhibit last year, will be in charge of the arrangements this season.

Babe Ruth Making Rapid Strides Towards Top of Ladder in American.

Chicago, July 9.—Tris Speaker, pilot of the Cleveland world's champions, has dethroned Harry Heilmann, the Detroit slugging outfielder, for batting honors in the American league, according to averages released Saturday, which include games of Wednesday.

The averages are those of players who have participated in 45 games or more. Speaker increased his mark from 408 a week ago to 415, while Heilmann suffered a slump going and less Wednesday in the game between the White Sox and Tigers, and now is batting .400.

Ruth is hitting .378. The Yankee slugger cracked out three home runs during the past week and brought his string to 31 circuit drives. Ruth also is proving the best run getter in the Johnson circuit, having registered 84 runs for his club.
