Missoula, Aug. 18.—There is renewed talk of an east side railroad for the Bitter Root valley. Leases for a right of way which were about to expire have been renewed. These leases carry options for purchase. A railway line was surveyed on the east side of the valley about 10 years ago.

It is thought that the Northern Pacific has some interest in the road, even if it already has a branch line on the other side of the valley, running its entire length.
