Enrollment in the Great Falls public schools this year is expected to top the total of 5166 reached the last school year by 100 or more.

The high school, which last year had a total enrollment of 984, and an actual attendance of slightly less than 900 at the end of the school year, is expected to register 1000 this fall.

COLLEGES DRAW BOYS AND GIRLS OF GREAT FALLS

Thirteen of Last Year's High School Graduates Plan to Enter State University.

Of the 103 seniors who were graduated last June, 55 are planning to go to college. Of the 1920 class 41 out of 57 went away; of the 1919 graduates 42 out of 84; in 1918, 33 out of 61; and of the 1917 class, 29 out of 55 seniors went to institutions of higher learning.

Last June 28 girls and 27 boys signified their intention to enter colleges. In the fall of 1920, Montana State college at Bozeman recruited 8 students in Great Falls and the Montana State university got 8.

Oldest in length of continuous service in the public school faculty is Miss Jessie L. Rich, who began as teacher in Great Falls in 1880, when the entire school system was housed in a small building still standing on the south side, S. D. Largent, now city superintendent of schools, came to Great Falls as a teacher in 1890, and has been in the employ of the school district ever since with the exception of one period for which he failed of election to the city superintendency.


