WOMAN WHIRLS ON SHEER WALL OF MOTORDROME

Sheesley Carnival, Under Auspices Labor and Veterans, Opens Week's Stand.

Anyone given to shortness of breath had best not see Olive Hager's act at the Sheesley carnival. The spectator wants an unimpeded respiratory apparatus to watch her. At a speed of 50 miles an hour she rides her motordrome on the perpendicular wall of what would serve for a tank, but what is known on the carnival grounds as the motordrome.

Held against the wall by her own velocity, Miss Hager quits her grip on the handlebars, rides sideways like the prime horseman of the civil war period and does various little things like that. With the machine still unguided she "lets the old cat die" as her speed diminishes and spirals down to the floor of the pit. It's an act that would go over big on any circuit and is said not to have an equal on the road at the present time. Captain Harry Haynes also rides the wall with a motorcycle, but he swaps his machine for an automobile later on and races Miss Hager. Two wheels of the miniature car get up on the perpendicular wall.

Captain Hart's wild animal circus is another headliner at the carnival. Four black maned African lions are put through their paces by the successor of the man who 10 weeks ago is declared to have been eaten by the animals. Princess Tessie is tutor to two leopards and two pumas in the same area and Captain Hart closes the act with performing bears. Hee Ho Gray, a white man who carries a name sponsored by Indians, has a roping act that equals if it does not surpass Bill Dooly of Pantages fame. Gray's line of patter is clever and so is his rope spinning and lassoing.

The John Teel girls have a spectacular show at another location on the grounds, and of course there are the side shows, the roller coaster, the ferris wheel and the merry-go-round. The carnival tents are spread on Eleventh street between Central and First avenue north and the show is the principal attraction at the Labor day program given by the World War Veterans and the Cascade County Trades & Labor assembly.

Roundup Sisters Open Parochial School as Hospital Nears End

Roundup, Sept. 5.—Roundup's first parochial school opened last week with 65 scholars. School for the present is being held in the basement of the Catholic church, pending the completion of the fine new brick school which is now under construction. It is expected that from 150 to 200 pupils will be in attendance by the time the school is ready for occupancy.

A force of five sisters comprises the staff of instructors, and classes will be taught up to and including the eighth grade.

The plans for the sisters' new hospital have been completed and within two weeks excavating for the basement will be started. It will be located in the McLeary addition and will represent an investment of close to \$100,000 when completed. Thirty rooms will be finished in the first unit and this will be added to as the needs of the community require. Three carloads of furnishings are on the road from Goldfield, Nevada, where the sisters formerly conducted a hospital and this will be used in partly outfitting the new building.
