NEW RECORD SET BY PRODUCTION FROM ROUNDUP TIME. Republic Raises 3256 Tons of Coal in Eight Hours; Collieries Add a Day. Special to The Tribune. Roundup, Oct. 3.—The big Republic coal mine at Klein again broke its record for production, last week, having raised to the surface 3,256 tons of coal in eight hours, including a wait of 37 minutes for coal. This is an average of a ton of coal every eight seconds of actual working time. Only one shift a day is worked at this mine, which is the largest shaft mine operating west of the Mississippi.
