DEFENDANT DENIES BLAME FOR CRASH

George Roy Says He Was Not Responsible for Collision; Case Is Continued.

Responsibility for the collision of cars driven by Arthur Dubb and George Roy, a hotel keeper, on Gravel Hill, west of the city, in which the former's car emerged from a rear wheel, was not fixed by Police Magistrate H. A. Sheppard Monday, following two police court hearings. The case will be continued this (Tuesday) morning. Dubb told the court that he was driving into Great Falls and saw the Roy machine approaching as he came over the hill. The crash occurred about the middle of the grade, he testified, and the rear of his machine was shoved off the road by the impact. He said Roy was driving at a high rate of speed and did not stop to learn the result of the collision. Roy maintained that the crash did not occur through any fault of his, and denied that he was traveling at an excessive rate of speed.
