

New York, Oct. 13.—(By The Associated Press.)—"I have the National baseball club in the world," declared John J. McGraw, manager of the Giants, a few moments after his team had won the world's baseball classic Thursday afternoon...

Miller Huggins, leader of the vanquished, declared his men had no alibi to offer and gave the Giants full credit for their triumph. It was a wonderful series, he remarked, but the Yankees simply were unable to do any consecutive hitting...

McGraw, nervous with excitement, was swamped by admirers as he left the clubhouse. Artie Neff, the pitcher who led the Giants to their final victory, shed his uniform as calmly as though it were an ordinary day...

Both managers agreed it was the greatest world series ever played. And so did the president of the National league, John A. Heydler, who tossed his presidential dignity to the winds when the Giants closed the series with a dazzling double play...

"We've been waiting 17 years to see the Giants at the top of the ladder," he said. "I do not know how to express my happiness. The old National league is ahead again after a bitter fight in which they proved game to the core."

Several thousand rosters waited outside the Giants' clubhouse to greet their idols. A few of them were allowed to go inside. One of these was Mrs. Julia Wilson, gray haired mother of the president of the United States...
