Towns Were in a Precarious Position During Early Days of World War.

Washington.—(Special)—Four cities of Upper Silesia which were reported to have been seized by Polish insurgents...

The cities are Tarnowitz, Beuthen, Koenigschutte and Katowitz. Though they are situated virtually at the meeting point of pre-war Russia, Germany and Austria-Hungary...

Within Few Miles of Each Other.—The four cities lie within a few miles of each other and in the heart of the coal fields for which the country is famous.

Of these cities, Beuthen alone is of appreciable size. The others are the direct result of the development of coal mines and metallurgical industries in the vicinity after the middle of the 19th century.

Silesian Pittsburgh.—Koenigschutte, with nearly 75,000 inhabitants, is the metropolis of the Upper Silesian mining district...

Voted Against Germany.—Tarnowitz, a few miles north of Beuthen, is the smallest of the group. Its inhabitants number close to 15,000.

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
HOLD BOXING BOUT ONLY PRIZE FIGHT; BARRED IN KANSAS


RECORDS DISAGREE ON PHAROAH RULING DURING OPPRESSION
