





HATCHERY HERE WILL USE WATER RAISED BY RAM

Secretary of Sportsmen Says Gravity Flow Not Possible at Giant Springs.

The principal difficulty which will be met with by the state game and fish commission in the erection of the proposed fish hatchery at Great Falls, which is sought by members of the Great Falls Rod & Gun club and the Great Falls Commercial club, is the elevation of water for use in the rearing ponds, according to M. S. Carpenter, of Belgrade, secretary of the Montana State Sportsmen's association.

For the purpose of having the matter treated properly by the state game and fish commission, the members of the Rod & Gun club passed a resolution inviting the state commission to hold its next meeting in Great Falls.

Mr. Carpenter made an appeal to the sportsmen of Great Falls to educate the youth in the protection of the state's wild life.

Scott Leavitt, president of the Great Falls Ad club, extended an invitation to Mr. Carpenter and the members of the Rod and Gun club to attend the meeting of the club at Hotel Rainbow Friday noon.

President Wilcoxson suggested that the members of the gun club carry on a membership campaign and stated that the club should have a membership of 1,000.
